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8	ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE ON 21ST CENTURY FIREARM
9	LAWS.
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11	WHEREAS, protecting the public safety and welfare of
12	citizens is the most basic duty of government, and to this
13	end, effective and reasonable measures must be implemented to
14	keep Alabamians safe from violence; and
15	WHEREAS, Section 26 of the Official Recompilation of
16	the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the
17	Second Amendment to the United States Constitution protect the
18	right of an individual to bear arms in self-defense, and this
19	right is a fundamental right derived from the inherent
20	principle of self-preservation of individuals who have a need
21	to protect themselves in both their homes and in their
22	movements throughout this state; and
23	WHEREAS, it is appropriate to maintain a dialogue
24	with interested parties and experts throughout this state
25	regarding the effectiveness of existing firearms laws in
26	curbing abuse of firearms while minimizing the impact of any

restrictions on law-abiding firearm owners; and

WHEREAS, the laws in this state, as well as

surrounding states, regarding the possession and carrying of

firearms are in need of review to determine potential measures

to enhance public safety while preserving residents'

fundamental right to bear arms; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is created a Task Force on 21st Century Firearm Laws.

- (a) The appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure that the Task Force on 21st Century Firearms membership is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.
- (b) The membership of the task force shall consist of appointments made by the following:
- (1) The Secretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, or his or her designee.
- (2) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and one member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Minority Leader.
- (3) Two members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and one member of the Senate appointed by the Senate Minority Leader.
- (4) The Director of the Office of Prosecution Services, or his or her designee.

- 1 (5) The Director of the Business Council of Alabama, 2 or his or her designee.
- 3 (6) A sheriff appointed by the Alabama Sheriffs
  4 Association.
- 5 (7) A chief of police appointed by the Alabama 6 Association of Chiefs of Police.
- 7 (8) The Chair of the Alabama Peace Officers' 8 Standards and Training Commission, or his or her designee.

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- (9) The Commissioner of the Alabama Department of Mental Health, or his or her designee.
  - (10) Four members representing gun rights advocacy organizations operating in Alabama that have at least 50 members, to be jointly appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
  - (11) A superintendent of a local school board appointed by the School Superintendents of Alabama.
  - (12) A district attorney appointed by the Alabama District Attorneys Association.
- 20 (13) An educator, appointed by the Alabama Education 21 Association.
- (c) The task force shall have all of the following duties:
- (1) Perform a complete and comprehensive review and assessment of state laws and regulations regarding firearms in Alabama.

1 (2) Perform a review of the laws and regulations of 2 firearms in other states.

- (3) Identify issues and problem areas in the laws governing the possession and carrying of firearms in Alabama that can be addressed through legislation.
- (4) Submit recommendations for needed legislative actions to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the appropriate House and Senate committees no later than the last legislative day of the 2017 Regular Session at which time the task force shall be dissolved; however, if the task force has not completed its work at this time, the task force shall submit its report as provided in this subdivision no later than October 1, 2017, at which time the task force shall be dissolved.
- (d)(1) Appointments to the task force shall be made within 30 days after the effective date of this act.
- (2) The task force shall hold its first meeting at the call of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, with the date, time, and location of the meeting designated by the Speaker.
- (3) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall select one of the appointed members and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall select one of the appointed members to serve as co-chairs of the task force.
- (4) At the first meeting, the task force shall elect other officers as determined by the task force, and shall set dates, times, and locations of subsequent meetings.

1 (e) The House of Representatives and the Senate 2 shall provide the necessary staff and support to the task 3 force to perform its duties.

- (f) Members of the task force shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for necessary expenses in attending meetings of the task force according to the policies and procedures of their respective appointing authority.
- (g) Legislative members of the task force shall be entitled to their legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day they attend a meeting of the task force in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.
- (h) A copy of this resolution shall be provided to all appointing authorities of the task force.
