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20	Relating to pistol permits; to amend Section
21	13A-11-75.1, of the Code of Alabama 1975, as amended by Act
22	2019-525 of the 2019 Regular Session, providing for the
23	issuance of a pistol permit to a retired military veteran
24	without the payment of a fee, to further authorize an active
25	member of the U.S. Armed Forces and a honorably discharged
26	veteran to be issued a pistol permit without the payment of a
27	fee.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 13A-11-75.1, Code of Alabama
1975, as amended by Act 2019-525 of the 2019 Regular Session,
is further amended to read as follows:

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"§13A-11-75.1.

"(a) The words retired military veteran as used in
this section, unless the context clearly requires a different
meaning, means only those persons who are retirees from active
duty in the Army, or the Navy, or the Marine Corps, or the Air
Force, or the Coast Guard of the United States or any reserve
or National Guard component thereof. For the purposes of this
section, the following words have the following meanings:

13 "(1) HONORABLY DISCHARGED VETERAN. A person who has 14 been honorably discharged from the U.S. Armed Forces as 15 evidenced by the veteran's DD-214 form, or if the veteran does not have a DD-214 form, as evidenced by the Veteran's Record 16 and Report of Separation Honorable Discharge Record. 17 18 "(2) MEMBER OF THE U.S. ARMED FORCES. An active member of the U.S. Armed Forces as evidenced by a current 19 20 valid U.S. Military Identification.

"(3) RETIRED MILITARY VETERAN. A person who is
 retired from active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces as evidenced
 by a U.S. government issued Veteran Identification Card or
 <u>Veteran's DD-214 form.</u>
 "(4) U.S. ARMED FORCES. The Army, Navy, Marine

1 "(b)(1) Any member of the U.S. Armed Forces, an 2 honorable discharged veteran, or any retired military veteran who meets the conditions for issuance of a pistol permit 3 pursuant to Section 13A-11-75 shall be eligible to obtain the 4 5 pistol permit without paying a fee for the permit. Upon 6 approval of the pistol permit application, the pistol permit 7 shall be issued by the sheriff of the county in which the 8 veteran resides upon presentation by the.

9 "(2) In order to obtain a pistol permit under this 10 section, a retired military veteran of the United States Armed 11 Forces government issued Veteran Identification Card or a 12 DD-214 Proof of Military Service form and shall present 13 sufficient proof that the person is a military retiree, an active member of the U.S. Armed Forces shall present proof of 14 15 his or her current status as an active member of the U.S. Armed Forces, and an honorably discharged veteran shall 16 present proof that he or she has been honorably discharged 17 18 from the U.S. Armed Forces.

19 "<u>(3)</u> The retired military veteran shall holder of 20 <u>the pistol permit issued under this section may</u> apply for 21 renewal as required by law, but shall be eligible to obtain 22 renewed pistol permits without paying a fee as long as he or 23 she meets the conditions for renewal of the permit.

"(c) In the event <u>an active member of the U.S. Armed</u>
Forces, a person who has been honorably discharged from the
<u>U.S. Armed Forces, or</u> a retired veteran, to whom a pistol
permit has been issued pursuant to subsection (b), is

1 suspected of or is charged with or convicted of a felony 2 involving moral turpitude, as defined in Section 17-3-30.1, domestic violence in the first degree, as defined in Section 3 13A-6-130, or domestic violence in the second degree, as 4 5 defined in Section 13A-6-131, then the sheriff of the county in which the retired veteran holder of the pistol permit 6 7 resides may revoke the pistol permit. The sheriff shall notify the retired veteran holder of the pistol permit in writing and 8 by registered mail that his or her pistol permit is revoked. 9 10 The sheriff shall state the reasons for the revocation and order the retiree holder of the pistol permit to return his or 11 her pistol permit to that sheriff within 30 days. Should the 12 13 retired veteran holder of the pistol permit refuse to return the pistol permit within the 30-day limit and continue to 14 15 carry the handgun, he or she shall be guilty of carrying a weapon without a license or carrying a concealed weapon, 16 17 whichever might be the case.

18 "(d) In the event that any active duty member of the U.S. Armed Forces resigns from his or her duties as an active 19 20 duty member of the U.S. Armed Forces without being honorably 21 discharged or is dishonorably discharged from the U.S. Armed 22 Forces, the former member shall immediately forfeit his or her 23 permit obtained under this section and shall return the permit 24 to the sheriff within 30 days. If the former member of the 25 U.S. Armed Forces who resigned or was dishonorably discharged 26 fails to return the pistol permit within the 30-day time period and continues to carry a pistol, the former member 27

1	shall be quilty of carrying a weapon without a license o	r
2	carrying a concealed weapon, as appropriate."	

3 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 4 first day of the third month following its passage and 5 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
