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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, an all-terrain vehicle
9		(ATV) and a recreational off-highway vehicle are
10		off-road vehicles that may be registered by the
11		owner with the Alabama State Law Enforcement
12		Agency. An all-terrain vehicle is defined to
13		include a vehicle of not more than 60 inches in
14		width. A recreational off-highway vehicle is
15		defined to include a vehicle of not more than 80
16		inches in width or more than 2,500 pounds.
17		This bill would specify that the authorized
18		width of an all-terrain vehicle or a recreational
19		off-highway vehicle would be measured from the
20		outside of the tire rim directly across on the
21		other side of the vehicle and would increase the
22		authorized weight of a recreational off-highway
23		vehicle to 3,500 pounds.
24		Under existing law, the registration fees
25		are forty-five dollars (\$45) for a vehicle used for
26		public use and fifteen dollars (\$15) for a vehicle

used for private use. Private use includes
agricultural use.

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This bill would amend the definition of private use to include vehicles used as an implement of husbandry. This bill would define public use as off-road public use on designated public areas.

Under existing law, fees from the registrations and other fees are credited to the off-road vehicle account in the State Treasury and are subject to appropriation generally for education and training on all-terrain vehicle and recreational off-highway vehicle safety, administration and enforcement of the law, development of off-vehicle trails, and grants to local government for off road trails.

This bill would deposit the fees in the State Treasury to the credit of the Public Safety Fund of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency.

Under existing law, agents for the registration of boats are automatically designated as agents for registration of all-terrain and off-highway recreational vehicles.

This bill would provide that the automatic designation of the agents for registration purposes would be permissive.

20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:			
21	Section 1. Sections 32-12A-1, 32-12A-3, 32-12A-4,			
22	32-12A-5, and 32-12A-12 of the Code of Alabama 1975, as last			
23	amended by Act 2019-104, are amended to read as follows:			
24	"\$32-12A-1.			
25	"For purposes of this chapter, the following terms			
26	shall have the following meanings:			

"(1) ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES (ATV). Every motor vehicle 60 inches or less in width, measured from the outside of the tire rim to the outside of the tire rim directly across on the vehicle, having a dry weight of 1,500 pounds or less, designed to travel on three or more non-highway tires, and manufactured for off-road use by a single operator or by an operator and not more than one passenger as provided by the manufacturer.

"(2) PRIVATE USE. Use exclusively on private property or as an implement of husbandry as defined in Section 32-8-2.

"(3) PUBLIC USE. Off-road public use in designated public areas.

"(2)(4) OFF-ROAD VEHICLE. Any motorized vehicle not designed for use on a highway and capable of cross-country travel on land, snow, ice, marsh, swampland, or other natural terrain. The term includes any all-terrain vehicle and recreational off-highway vehicle. The term excludes any golf cart; any vehicle used for military, fire, emergency, or law enforcement purposes; any motorboat; any vehicles used exclusively on airport property; all farm machinery, farm tractors, and other self-propelled equipment for harvesting and transportation of forest products, for clearing land for planting, for utility services and maintenance, or for earth moving, construction, or mining; and self-propelled lawnmowers, snowblowers, and garden or lawn tractors while such vehicles are being used exclusively for their designed

purposes. The term does not include any motor vehicle for which a certificate of title is required by Chapter 8.

"(3) (5) RECREATIONAL OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE. Any off-road vehicle 80 inches or less in width, measured from the outside of the tire rim to the outside of the tire rim directly across on the vehicle, having a dry weight of 2,500 3,500 pounds or less, designed and manufactured to travel on four or more non-highway tires for off-road use by an operator and the number of passengers as provided by the manufacturer.

" $\frac{(4)}{(6)}$ SECRETARY. The Secretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency.

"\$32-12A-3.

- "(a) An application for registration or continued registration shall be made to the Secretary of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency or an authorized agent of the agency in a form prescribed by the secretary. The form shall state the name and address of every owner of the vehicle.
- "(b) A person who purchases an all-terrain vehicle or recreational off-highway vehicle from a retail dealer shall may make application for registration to the dealer at the point of sale. The dealer shall provide the registration application to the purchaser and submit the completed registration application and fees to the secretary at least once each month. The dealer may deduct a fee of two dollars fifty cents (\$2.50) for each registration.
- "(c) Upon Within 30 days after the receipt of the application and the appropriate fee, the secretary or agent

shall issue to the applicant or provide to the dealer an assigned registration sticker. Once issued, the registration sticker shall be affixed to the vehicle in a manner prescribed by the secretary. A dealer subject to subsection (b) shall provide the registration materials to the purchaser.

"(d) Each agent for the registration of boats shall may also be a registered agent for all-terrain vehicle or recreational off-highway vehicle registration. The secretary may prescribe the accounting and procedural requirements necessary to assure efficient handling of registrations and registration fees. Agents shall strictly comply with the accounting and procedural requirements.

"(e) In addition to other fees prescribed by law, an issuance fee of five dollars (\$5) shall be charged for each all-terrain vehicle or recreational off-highway vehicle registration renewal, duplicate or replacement registration card certificate, replacement decal, or an all-terrain vehicle or recreational off-highway vehicle registration transfer issued.

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"All-terrain vehicles or recreational off-highway vehicles may be registered for private use that are used exclusively for private or agricultural use or used exclusively on private property or for public use. Public use includes private use. Private use registration Registration is valid for three years from the date of issuance. Private or agricultural use registrations are and is not transferable.

"The secretary shall provide to the registrant a registration card certificate that includes the registration number, the date of registration, the make and serial number of the vehicle, the owner's name and address, and additional information the secretary may require. Information concerning each registration shall be retained by the secretary. The registration is not valid unless signed by at least one owner. Upon a satisfactory showing that the registration card certificate has been lost or destroyed, the secretary shall issue a replacement registration card certificate upon payment of a fee of five dollars (\$5). The fees collected from replacement registration cards certificates shall be deposited in the off-road vehicle account in the State Treasury and credited to the Public Safety Fund of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency.

"§32-12A-12.

"(a) Fees from the registration of all-terrain vehicles and recreational off-highway vehicles shall be deposited in the State Treasury and credited to the off-road vehicle account Public Safety Fund.

"(b) Subject to appropriation by the Legislature,
money in the account may only be used for the following
purposes:

"(1) Education and training on all-terrain vehicle and recreational off-highway vehicle safety.

1	" (2) Administration, enforcement, and implementation
2	of this chapter.
3	"(3) Acquisition, maintenance, and development of
4	off-road vehicle trails and use areas.
5	"(4) Grant-in-aid programs to counties and
6	municipalities to construct and maintain off-road vehicle
