## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 16-11-130 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 exemptions from Code Sections 16-11-126 through 16-11-127.2, so as to authorize certain
- 3 persons who are citizens of this state and have retired with at least ten years of aggregate
- 4 service as a law enforcement officer with powers of arrest under the laws of any state of the
- 5 United States or of the United States to carry a handgun anywhere within this state; to require
- 6 such persons to possess and to meet the standards for issuance of an identification card for
- 7 retired law enforcement officers as issued by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and
- 8 Training Council; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 9 purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

11 SECTION 1.

- 12 Code Section 16-11-130 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to exemptions
- 13 from Code Sections 16-11-126 through 16-11-127.2, is amended by revising subsection (c)
- 14 as follows:
- 15 "(c) Code Sections 16-11-126 through 16-11-127.2 shall not apply to or affect any:
- 16 (1) Sheriff, retired sheriff, deputy sheriff, or retired deputy sheriff if such retired sheriff
- or deputy sheriff is eligible to receive or is receiving benefits under the Peace Officers'
- Annuity and Benefit Fund provided under Chapter 17 of Title 47, the Sheriffs' Retirement
- Fund of Georgia provided under Chapter 16 of Title 47, or any other public retirement
- system established under the laws of this state for service as a law enforcement officer;
- 21 (2) Member of the Georgia State Patrol, or agent of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation,
- or retired member of the Georgia State Patrol, or retired agent of the Georgia Bureau of
- Investigation if such retired member or agent is receiving benefits under the Employees'
- 24 Retirement System;
- 25 (3) Full-time law enforcement chief executive engaging in the management of a county,
- 26 municipal, state, state authority, or federal law enforcement agency in the State of

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27 Georgia, including any college or university law enforcement chief executive that who is registered or certified by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council; 28 29 or retired law enforcement chief executive that who formerly managed a county, municipal, state, state authority, or federal law enforcement agency in the State of 30 Georgia, including any college or university law enforcement chief executive that who 31 was registered or certified at the time of his or her retirement by the Georgia Peace 32 33 Officer Standards and Training Council, if such retired law enforcement chief executive is receiving benefits under the Peace Officers' Annuity and Benefit Fund provided under 34 35 Chapter 17 of Title 47 or is retired in good standing and receiving benefits from a county, municipal, State of Georgia, state authority, or federal retirement system; or 36 37 (4) Police officer of any county, municipal, state, state authority, or federal law enforcement agency in the State of Georgia, including any college or university police 38 officer that who is registered or certified by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and 39 40 Training Council, or retired police officer of any county, municipal, state, state authority, or federal law enforcement agency in the State of Georgia, including any college or 41 university police officer that who was registered or certified at the time of his or her 42 43 retirement by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council, if such retired 44 employee police officer is receiving benefits under the Peace Officers' Annuity and 45 Benefit Fund provided under Chapter 17 of Title 47 or is retired in good standing and 46 receiving benefits from a county, municipal, State of Georgia, state authority, or federal 47 retirement system; or 48 (5) Person who is a citizen of this state and: 49 (A) Has retired with at least ten years of aggregate service as a law enforcement officer with powers of arrest under the laws of any state of the United States or of the United 50 51 States; (B) Separated from service in good standing, as determined by criteria established by 52 the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council, from employment with his 53 or her most recent law enforcement agency; and 54 55 (C) Possesses on his or her person an identification card for retired law enforcement officers as issued by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council; 56 provided, however, that such person meets the standards for the issuance of such card 57 as provided for by the council, including, but not limited to, maintenance of 58 59 qualification in firearms training. In addition, any such sheriff, retired sheriff, deputy sheriff, retired deputy sheriff, member 60 of the Georgia State Patrol, retired member of the Georgia State Patrol, agent of the 61

Georgia Bureau of Investigation, retired agent of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation,

active or retired law enforcement chief executive, person who is a retired law enforcement

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officer as provided for in paragraph (5) of this subsection, or other law enforcement officer referred to in this subsection shall be authorized to carry a handgun on or off duty anywhere within the this state and the provisions of Code Sections 16-11-126 through 16-11-127.2 shall not apply to the carrying of such firearms."

## **SECTION 2.**

69 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
