A RESOLUTION

- 1 To commend the Nation of Israel for its cordial and mutually beneficial relationship with the
- 2 United States and with the State of Georgia; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Israel has been granted her lands under and through the oldest recorded deed,
- 4 as recorded in the Old Testament, a tome of scripture held sacred and revered by Jews and
- 5 Christians, alike, as presenting the acts and words of God; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the claim and presence of the Jewish people in Israel has remained constant
- 7 throughout the past 4,000 years of history; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the legal basis for the establishment of the modern State of Israel was a binding
- 9 act of international law established in the San Remo Resolution, which was unanimously
- adopted by the League of Nations in 1922 and subsequently affirmed by both houses of the
- 11 United States Congress; and
- 12 WHEREAS, this resolution affirmed the establishment of a national home for the Jewish
- 13 people in the historical region of the Land of Israel, including the areas of Judea, Samaria,
- 14 and Jerusalem; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Article 80 of the United Nations charter recognized the continued validity of
- 16 the rights granted to states or peoples which already existed under international instruments,
- and, therefore, the 1922 League of Nations resolution remains valid, and the 650,000 Jews
- 18 currently residing in the areas of Judea, Samaria, and eastern Jerusalem reside there
- 19 legitimately; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Israel declared its independence and self-governance on May 14, 1948, with the
- 21 goal of reestablishing its God-given and legally recognized lands as a homeland for the
- 22 Jewish people; and

23 WHEREAS, the United States, having been the first country to recognize Israel as an

- 24 independent nation and as Israel's principal ally, has enjoyed a close and mutually beneficial
- 25 relationship with Israel and her people; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Israel is the greatest friend and ally of the United States in the Middle East, and
- 27 the values of our two nations are so intertwined that it is impossible to separate one from the
- 28 other; and
- 29 WHEREAS, there are those in the Middle East who have continually sought to destroy Israel,
- 30 from the time of its inception as a state, and those same enemies of Israel also hate and seek
- 31 to destroy the United States; and
- 32 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia and Israel have enjoyed cordial and mutually beneficial
- 33 relations since 1948, a friendship that continues to strengthen with each passing year; and
- 34 WHEREAS, there is a special bond of friendship between the citizens of Georgia and Israel
- 35 that inspires the people of Georgia to stand with the people of Israel in solidarity and
- 36 welcome all opportunities to grow our already deep relationship at all levels, including
- 37 cultural, academic, and business endeavors; and
- 38 WHEREAS, Georgia is proud to serve as home to the Israeli Consulate General for the
- 39 Southeast; and
- 40 WHEREAS, Georgia is proud to be the home of over 45 Israeli companies that employ more
- 41 than 2,000 people; and
- 42 WHEREAS, the Georgia Department of Economic Development operates an established
- 43 trade office in Israel; and
- 44 WHEREAS, the cities of Atlanta, Georgia, and Ra'anana, Israel, are official sister cities; and
- 45 WHEREAS, the 2008 Atlanta Jewish Film Festival sold 15,000 tickets to its 12 days of
- 46 movies at three locations, smashing the 2007 record of 9,000 tickets, making Atlanta's
- 47 festival the number two Jewish film festival in the nation behind San Francisco and making
- 48 the festival the most attended film festival of any kind in Atlanta; and

49 WHEREAS, the Georgia Institute of Technology is involved in a joint initiative with Israel

- 50 in developing nanotechnology, a research sector in which Israel is emerging as a global
- 51 leader; and
- 52 WHEREAS, Georgia State University and the Georgia International Law Enforcement
- 53 Exchange have an established program with law enforcement agencies in Israel; and
- 54 WHEREAS, the University of Georgia and the Hebrew University of Jerusalem have a
- 55 program to close the gap of time between acts of terror and governmental response by
- studying the ways in which a society that has long been subject to political violence has
- 57 addressed the effects of such violence on its peoples; and
- 58 WHEREAS, Israel is a top export destination for Georgia with exports totaling over \$212
- 59 million, including transportation equipment, paper, computer and electronics equipment,
- 60 beverages and tobacco products, and machinery; and
- WHEREAS, Georgia imports over \$337 million from Israel through the Savannah Customs
- 62 District with top imports, including optical, surgical, and photo equipment; organic
- 63 chemicals; furniture; electrical machinery; and plastics; and
- 64 WHEREAS, Delta Air Lines connects Georgia and Israel with regular flight service,
- 65 providing the opportunity for business and cultural relationships to grow; and
- 66 WHEREAS, Georgia is proud to be a leader in the Israel Bonds program; and
- 67 WHEREAS, the Georgia Commission on the Holocaust works to draw lessons from the
- 68 history of the Holocaust in order to help lead new generations of Georgians beyond racism
- and bigotry; and
- 70 WHEREAS, Georgia is proud to be home to chapters of the American Israel Chamber of
- 71 Commerce, the American Israel Public Affairs Committee, the American Jewish Committee,
- 72 the Anti-Defamation League, Hadassah, the Jewish Federation, and the Jewish National
- 73 Fund.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 75 commend Israel for its cordial and mutually beneficial relationship with the United States
- and with the State of Georgia and support Israel in its legal, historical, moral, and God-given

77 right of self-governance and self-defense upon the entirety of its own lands, recognizing that

- 78 Israel is neither an attacking force nor an occupier of the lands of others, and that peace can
- be afforded the region only through a whole and united Israel.
- 80 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 81 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Israeli Ambassador to the United
- 82 States.
