A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 2 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to competencies and core curriculum, so as to require the study and
- 3 teaching of prescribed aspects of United States and world history; to provide for related
- 4 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Part 2 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 8 relating to competencies and core curriculum, is amended by adding a new Code section to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 "<u>20-2-149.2.</u>
- 11 <u>Instructional staff of public schools, in accordance with requirements and guidelines of the</u>
- 12 State Board of Education and the local board of education, shall teach efficiently and
- 13 <u>faithfully</u>, using the books and materials required that meet the highest standards for
- 14 professionalism and historic accuracy, following the prescribed courses of study, and
- 15 <u>employing approved methods of instruction, the following:</u>
- 16 (1) The history and content of the Declaration of Independence, including national
- sovereignty, natural law, self-evident truth, equality of all persons, limited government,
- popular sovereignty, and inalienable rights of life, liberty, and property, and how they
- 19 <u>form the philosophical foundation of our government;</u>
- 20 (2) The history, meaning, significance, and effect of the provisions of the Constitution
- of the United States and amendments thereto, with emphasis on each of the ten
- 22 <u>amendments that make up the Bill of Rights and how the Constitution provides the</u>
- 23 <u>structure of our government;</u>
- 24 (3) The arguments in support of adopting our republican form of government, as they are
- 25 <u>embodied in the most important of the Federalist Papers;</u>
- 26 (4) Flag education, including proper flag display and flag salute:

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| 27 | (5) The elements of civil government, including the primary functions of and |
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| 28 | interrelationships between the federal government, the state, and its counties, |
| 29 | municipalities, school systems, and special districts; |
| 30 | (6) The history of the United States, including the period of discovery, early colonies, |
| 31 | the War for Independence, the Civil War, the expansion of the United States to its present |
| 32 | boundaries, the world wars, and the civil rights movement to the present. American |
| 33 | history shall be viewed as factual, not as constructed, shall be viewed as knowable, |
| 34 | teachable, and testable, and shall be defined as the creation of a new nation based largely |
| 35 | on the universal principles stated in the Declaration of Independence; |
| 36 | (7) The history of the Holocaust (1933-1945), the systematic, planned annihilation of |
| 37 | European Jews and other groups by Nazi Germany, a watershed event in the history of |
| 38 | humanity, to be taught in a manner that leads to an investigation of human behavior, an |
| 39 | understanding of the ramifications of prejudice, racism, and stereotyping, and an |
| 40 | examination of what it means to be a responsible and respectful person, for the purposes |
| 41 | of encouraging tolerance of diversity in a pluralistic society and for nurturing and |
| 42 | protecting democratic values and institutions; |
| 43 | (8) The history of African Americans, including the history of African peoples before |
| 44 | the political conflicts that led to the development of slavery, the passage to America, the |
| 45 | $\underline{enslavement\ experience, abolition, and\ the\ contributions\ of\ African\ Americans\ to\ society.}$ |
| 46 | <u>Instructional materials shall include the contributions of African Americans to American</u> |
| 47 | society; |
| 48 | (9) The study of Hispanic contributions to the United States; |
| 49 | (10) The study of women's contributions to the United States; |
| 50 | (11) The study of native Americans' contributions to the United States; and |
| 51 | (12) In order to encourage patriotism, the sacrifices that veterans have made in serving |
| 52 | our country and protecting democratic values worldwide. Such instruction must occur |
| 53 | on or before Veterans Day and Memorial Day. Members of the instructional staff are |
| 54 | encouraged to use the assistance of local veterans when practicable." |
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55 SECTION 2.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
