A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 31-12-3.2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 meningococcal disease vaccinations and disclosures, so as to revise provisions regarding
- 3 vaccination against meningococcal disease of college students; to amend Article 2 of Chapter
- 4 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to physicians, so as to
- 5 authorize the administration of vaccines by pharmacists or nurses pursuant to vaccine
- 6 protocol agreements with physicians; to provide for definitions; to provide requirements for
- 7 the content of vaccine protocol agreements; to provide that a party to a vaccine protocol
- 8 agreement shall not delegate his or her authority; to limit the number of vaccine protocol
- 9 agreements into which a physician may enter at any one time; to prohibit certain entities from
- 10 entering into vaccine protocol agreements; to provide for rules and regulations; to provide
- 11 for limited liability; to provide for applicability; to provide for statutory construction; to
- 12 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

14 SECTION 1.

- 15 Code Section 31-12-3.2 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- meningococcal disease vaccinations and disclosures, is amended by revising subsection (b)
- 17 as follows:

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- 18 "(b) <u>In accordance with the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization</u>
- 19 Practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, newly admitted students
- 20 Students who are 18 years of age or older residing in campus housing as defined by the
- 21 <u>postsecondary educational institution or residing in sorority or fraternity houses</u> shall be
- required to sign a document provided by the postsecondary educational institution stating
- that he or she has received a vaccination against meningococcal disease not more than five
- 24 <u>years prior to such admittance</u> or reviewed the information provided as required by
- subsection (a) of this Code section. If a student is a minor, only a parent or guardian may
- sign such document."

27 SECTION 2.

28 Article 2 of Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to

- 29 physicians, is amended by revising Code Section 43-34-26.1, relating to influenza vaccine
- 30 protocol agreements, as follows:
- 31 "43-34-26.1.
- 32 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 33 (1) 'Administer' means the provision of a unit dose of influenza vaccine by a pharmacist
- or nurse pursuant to an influenza a vaccine order contained in an influenza a vaccine
- protocol agreement with a physician.
- 36 (2) 'Adverse event' means an event that is a negative consequence of the administration
- of influenza vaccine by a pharmacist or nurse that results in an unintended reaction,
- injury, or illness, which may or may not have been preventable.
- 39 (3) 'Board' means the Georgia Composite Medical Board.
- 40 (4) 'Nurse' means a registered professional nurse as defined in paragraph (9) of Code
- Section 43-26-3. The term shall also mean a licensed practical nurse as defined in
- 42 paragraph (5) of Code Section 43-26-32 who is regularly employed by a physician
- 43 <u>engaged in the active practice of medicine.</u>
- 44 (5) 'Pharmacist' means an individual licensed under Chapter 4 of Title 26 to engage in
- 45 <u>the practice of pharmacy in the State of Georgia.</u>
- 46 (6) 'Pharmacy intern' means a pharmacy intern as defined in paragraph (19) of Code
- 47 <u>Section 26-4-5.</u>
- 48 (7) 'Physician' means an individual licensed to practice medicine and surgery pursuant
- 49 <u>to this article and whose principal place of practice is located in this state.</u>
- 50 (4)(8) 'Vaccine' 'Influenza vaccine' means an inactivated virus administered by injection
- or a live attenuated virus administered by nasal spray that is prepared for the applicable
- 52 season and that is administered to produce or increase a specially prepared antigen which
- 53 <u>upon administration to a person will result in immunity to influenza, pneumococcal</u>
- 54 <u>disease, shingles, or meningitis.</u> to the influenza virus; provided, however, that a live
- 55 attenuated virus shall not be administered pursuant to this Code section to any individual
- 56 younger than 13 or older than 49 years of age; and provided, further, that a No live
- attenuated virus shall not be administered pursuant to this Code section unless the patient
- or his or her parent, if a minor, has signed an informed consent that he or she does not
- have a contraindication to this vaccine. The informed consent form shall list the
- 60 contraindications to the vaccine.
- 61 (5)(9) 'Vaccine order' 'Influenza vaccine order' means a prescription drug order,
- 62 contained in an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine protocol agreement, for influenza <u>a</u> vaccine issued by
- a physician for a group of patients who meet certain criteria and to be administered by a

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pharmacist or a nurse. An influenza A vaccine order shall also mean a prescription drug order, contained in an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement, for epinephrine issued by a physician for a group of patients who meet certain criteria and to be administered by a pharmacist or a nurse only upon the occurrence of an actual or perceived anaphylactic adverse reaction to the administered influenza vaccine provided that the influenza vaccine protocol agreement sets forth the signs and symptoms that warrant the administration of epinephrine.

- (6)(10) 'Vaccine protocol agreement' 'Influenza vaccine protocol agreement' means a written document mutually agreed upon and signed by a physician and a pharmacist or by a physician and a nurse, by which document the physician prescribes influenza a vaccine and epinephrine, if determined appropriate by the physician, by means of an influenza a vaccine order for administration by a pharmacist or a nurse.
- 76 (7) 'Nurse' means a registered professional nurse as defined in paragraph (9) of Code
 77 Section 43-26-3. The term shall also mean a licensed practical nurse as defined in
 78 paragraph (5) of Code Section 43-26-32 who is regularly employed by a physician who
 79 actively engaged in the private practice of medicine.
- 80 (8) 'Pharmacist' means an individual licensed under Chapter 4 of Title 26 to engage in the practice of pharmacy in the State of Georgia.
- 82 (9) 'Pharmacy intern' means a pharmacy intern as defined in paragraph (19) of Code 83 Section 26-4-5.
- 84 (10) 'Physician' means an individual licensed to practice medicine and surgery pursuant 85 to this article and whose principal place of practice is located in this state.
- 86 (b) A physician engaged in the active practice of medicine may prescribe influenza a vaccine for a group of patients via an influenza a vaccine order contained in an influenza 87 88 <u>a</u> vaccine protocol agreement to be administered by a pharmacist, provided the physician 89 is registered with the vaccination registry established by the Department of Public Health 90 pursuant to Code Section 31-12-3.1, commonly known as the Georgia Registry of 91 Immunization Transactions and Services; the pharmacist is located within the county of 92 the physician's place of registration with the vaccination registry or a county contiguous 93 thereto, and; the pharmacist holds current certification in Basic Cardiac Life Support and 94 has completed a course of training accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy 95 Education or similar health authority or professional body approved by the Georgia State Board of Pharmacy; and the pharmacist completes a training program approved by the 96 97 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in the basics of immunology which focuses on practice implementation and legal and regulatory issues, composed of at least 12 hours of 98 99 self-study and an assessment exam, at least eight hours of live seminar with a final exam, 100 and a hands-on assessment of intramuscular and subcutaneous injection technique. A

physician who is a party to an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine protocol agreement may also prescribe epinephrine via an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine order contained in an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine protocol agreement for administration by a pharmacist upon the occurrence of an actual or perceived anaphylactic adverse reaction to the administered influenza vaccine provided that the influenza vaccine protocol agreement sets forth the signs and symptoms that warrant the administration of epinephrine.

- (c) A physician engaged in the active practice of medicine may prescribe influenza a vaccine for a group of patients via an influenza a vaccine order contained in an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement to be administered by a nurse, provided the physician is registered with the vaccination registry established by the Department of Public Health pursuant to Code Section 31-12-3.1, commonly known as the Georgia Registry of Immunization Transactions and Services, the nurse is located within the county of the physician's place of registration with the vaccination registry or a county contiguous thereto, and the nurse holds current certification in Basic Cardiac Life Support. A physician who is a party to an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement may also prescribe epinephrine via an influenza a vaccine order contained in an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement for administration by a nurse upon the occurrence of an actual or perceived anaphylactic adverse reaction to the administered influenza vaccine provided that the influenza vaccine protocol agreement sets forth the signs and symptoms that warrant the administration of epinephrine.
- 121 (d) <u>A An influenza</u> vaccine protocol agreement between a physician and a pharmacist or 122 a physician and a nurse pursuant to this Code section shall, without limitation:
 - (1) Contain the current names, addresses, telephone numbers, and professional license numbers of the physician and the pharmacist or nurse;
 - (2) Contain a provision for immediate consultation between the pharmacist or nurse and the physician. If the physician is not available, the physician for purposes of consultation may designate another physician who concurs with the terms of the influenza vaccine protocol agreement;
- (3) Require the pharmacist or nurse to take a complete case history and determine whether the patient has had a physical examination within the past year and shall not administer a vaccine to a patient with any condition for which such vaccine is contraindicated;
- 133 (3)(4) Require the pharmacist or nurse to provide the influenza vaccine recipient with the appropriate and current Vaccine Information Statement (VIS) as provided by the federal
- 135 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention;

(5) Require the pharmacist or nurse to provide written information to be developed by

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the Department of Public Health to the vaccine recipient on the importance of having and 137 138 periodically seeing a primary care physician; 139 (6) Require the pharmacist or nurse to provide the vaccine recipient with a wallet-sized card on card stock paper containing the vaccine recipient's name, the pharmacist's or 140 141 nurse's name and phone number, the name and dosage of the vaccine, the location of 142 injection on the vaccine recipient, and the date of the administration of the vaccine in legible writing or printed type in a format determined by the Department of Public 143 144 Health. The written information required pursuant to paragraph (5) of this subsection 145 may be included on the card provided pursuant to this paragraph; 146 (4)(7) Require the pharmacist or nurse or his or her employer to retain documentation 147 of each dose of influenza vaccine administered. Such documentation shall include, but 148 not be limited to: 149 (A) The administering pharmacist's or nurse's name, address, telephone number, and 150 professional license number; 151 (B) The name, dose, manufacturer, and lot number of the influenza vaccine; (C) The vaccine recipient's name, address, date of birth, and telephone number; 152 153 (D) The date of administration and injection site; 154 (E) A signed and dated consent form by which the vaccine recipient acknowledges receipt of the VIS Vaccine Information Statement, and consents to the administration 155 156 of the influenza vaccine, and requires the pharmacy or nurse to notify the vaccine 157 recipient's primary care provider of the vaccine administered to the vaccine recipient; 158 and 159 (F) Any adverse events or complications that occur; 160 (8) Require the pharmacist or nurse to make documented reasonable efforts to obtain the 161 name of the vaccine recipient's primary care provider and to notify such primary care provider of the vaccine administered by the pharmacist or nurse within 72 hours of 162 163 administration; (9) Require the pharmacist or nurse to administer the vaccine to a patient in a private 164 165 location; 166 (5)(10) Require the pharmacist or nurse to enter the patient's influenza vaccine information in the Georgia Registry of Immunization Transactions and Services within 167 168 the registry's designated time frame, or as designated by the Department of Public Health. The Georgia Drugs and Narcotics Agency shall have the authority to impose sanctions 169 170 in accordance with subsection (r) of this Code section on any person subject to the 171 requirements of this paragraph who does not submit the required information and to 172 notify the applicable licensing board for such person of violations of this paragraph;

(6)(11) Require, as a condition of administration of the influenza vaccine, the influenza 173 vaccine recipient to remain under the observation of the administering pharmacist or 174 nurse for a period of not less than 15 minutes immediately subsequent to the 175 176 administration of the influenza vaccine; provided, however, that an administering pharmacist shall still be required to comply with the rules of the pharmacy; 177 178 (7)(12) Contain procedures to follow up on the occurrence of an adverse event or 179 complication including, if prescribed via an influenza a vaccine order contained in an 180 influenza a vaccine protocol agreement, the administration of epinephrine; 181 (8)(13) Provide for prioritization of influenza vaccine recipients in the event the supply 182 of influenza a vaccine is limited; and 183 (14) Require the pharmacist or nurse to maintain individual liability insurance coverage 184 or be individually covered by his or her employer's liability insurance coverage in an 185 amount not less than \$250,000.00 to cover claims arising from administration of vaccines 186 by the pharmacist or nurse pursuant to a vaccine protocol agreement and to provide proof 187 of such coverage to the physician for submission to the board with the vaccine protocol 188 agreement; and (9)(15) Be renewed and, if necessary, revised or updated biennially by the physician and 189 190 the pharmacist or nurse. A An influenza vaccine protocol agreement that is not renewed 191 biennially shall expire. 192 (e) A pharmacist who is a party to an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement pursuant to 193 this Code section shall not delegate the administration of influenza a vaccine to any 194 individual other than a pharmacy intern under the direct supervision of the pharmacist 195 whether or not any such other individual is under the supervision, direct or otherwise, of 196 the pharmacist. 197 (f) A nurse who is a party to an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement pursuant to this 198 Code section shall not delegate the administration of influenza a vaccine to any individual, 199 whether or not any such individual is under the supervision, direct or otherwise, of the 200 nurse; provided, however, that notwithstanding the requirement of employment by a 201 physician in paragraph (7)(4) of subsection (a) of this Code section, a registered 202 professional nurse who is a party to an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement pursuant to this Code section may delegate the administration of influenza a vaccine to a licensed 203 204 practical nurse under the direct on-site supervision of the registered professional nurse. 205 (g) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a nurse acting pursuant to an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement as provided in this Code section may possess and transport 206

influenza such vaccine and epinephrine.

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(h) A pharmacist or nurse administering influenza vaccines pursuant to an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement authorized by this Code section shall maintain policies and procedures for the handling and disposal of used or contaminated equipment and supplies.

- (i) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to authorize a physician to prescribe any <u>other</u> vaccines or other drugs pursuant to <u>an influenza a</u> vaccine protocol agreement or <u>influenza</u> vaccine order contained in <u>an influenza a</u> vaccine protocol agreement other than <u>influenza those</u> vaccines and epinephrine <u>specifically authorized in such vaccine protocol agreement or vaccine order.</u>
- 216 (j) A delegating physician may not enter into an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine protocol agreement 217 with more than ten pharmacists or nurses, or any combination thereof, at any one time; 218 provided, however, and notwithstanding the geographic limitations provided in subsections 219 (b) and (c) of this Code section, a delegating physician may enter into <u>an influenza a</u> 220 vaccine protocol agreement with more than ten pharmacists or nurses, or any combination 221 thereof, at any one time so long as the pharmacists or nurses are in the same public health 222 district as established pursuant to Code Section 31-3-15 and are employees or agents of the
- 224 (k) It shall be unlawful for a physician who is employed by a pharmacist or nurse to enter 225 into an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine protocol agreement or otherwise delegate medical acts to such 226 pharmacist or nurse. It shall be unlawful for a physician who is employed by a pharmacy 227 to enter into an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine protocol agreement or otherwise delegate medical acts 228 to a pharmacist or nurse who is also employed by such pharmacy.
- 229 (1) The board shall have the authority to promulgate rules and regulations governing a physician who is a party to an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement in order to carry out the intent and purposes of this Code section. Further, the board shall:
 - (1) Require that the influenza vaccine protocol agreement be filed by the physician with the board and be made available by the board for public inspection. The physician shall submit proof of the liability insurance coverage required pursuant to paragraph (12) of subsection (d) of this Code section and verification that the pharmacist or nurse holds current certification in Basic Cardiac Life Support as required by subsections (b) and (c) of this Code section with the vaccine protocol agreement. Upon the renewal of any vaccine protocol agreement, the physician shall submit documentation evidencing compliance by the pharmacist or nurse in making entries into the Georgia Registry of Immunization Transactions and Services required by paragraph (8) of subsection (d) of this Code section; and
- 242 (2) Promulgate by rule an approved standard protocol template that may be utilized as 243 an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine protocol agreement and make such template available on the 244 board's website.

245 (m) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to require a physician to enter into an

- 246 <u>influenza a</u> vaccine protocol agreement. A public or private managed care system, health
- 247 plan, hospital, insurance company, or similar entity shall not require a physician,
- 248 pharmacist, or nurse to enter into an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement as a condition
- for participation in or reimbursement from such entity.
- 250 (n) No physician who complies with the provisions of this Code section shall be subject
- 251 to criminal or civil liability or discipline for unprofessional conduct for:
- 252 (1) Entering into an influenza a vaccine protocol agreement with a pharmacist or nurse;
- 253 (2) Issuing an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine order contained in an influenza <u>a</u> vaccine protocol
- agreement with a pharmacist or nurse; or
- 255 (3) The acts or omissions of a pharmacist or nurse pursuant to an influenza a vaccine
- protocol agreement including the administration of influenza a vaccine or epinephrine.
- Nothing in this subsection shall be interpreted as altering liability of an employer for acts
- of his or her employees.
- 259 (o) This Code section shall not apply to any activities conducted within a hospital,
- 260 physician's office, nursing home, or other health care facility designated by the department
- or <u>conducted</u> within any other facility or entity owned, operated, or leased by a hospital.
- 262 (p) This Code section shall not be interpreted as limiting the authority of any authorized
- person to dispense or administer influenza vaccine vaccines or other medications.
- 264 (q) No influenza vaccine protocol agreement entered into pursuant to this Code section
- shall permit a pharmacist or nurse to administer an any of the following:
- 266 (1) An influenza vaccine to any child under the age of 13 without an individual
- prescription from a physician;
- 268 (2) A pneumococcal disease vaccine to any child under the age of 18 without an
- individual prescription from a physician;
- 270 (3) Any vaccines containing a live attenuated virus to a child under the age of 13; or
- 271 (4) A meningitis vaccine to any child under the age of 18.
- 272 and consent Consent of the child's parent or legal guardian shall be a condition precedent
- 273 to the administration of an influenza a vaccine to a child under the age of 18.
- 274 (r)(1) A pharmacist or nurse who does not comply with paragraph (14) of subsection (d)
- of this Code section may be assessed a fine of up to \$2,500.00 by the board.
- 276 (2) A pharmacist or nurse who administers a vaccine without a vaccine protocol
- 277 agreement as required by this Code section may be assessed a fine of up to \$2,500.00 and
- 278 <u>may be prohibited from administering vaccines pursuant to this Code section for up to</u>
- one year as determined by the board.

280	(3) A pharmacist or nurse who does not comply with paragraph (8) of subsection (d) of
281	this Code section may be subject to the following sanctions by the Georgia Drugs and
282	Narcotics Agency:
283	(A) Upon the first violation, the issuance of a warning;
284	(B) Upon the second violation, a fine of up to \$5,000.00; and
285	(C) Upon a third or subsequent violation, the loss of privileges to administer vaccines
286	pursuant to this Code section.
287	(4) The sanctions contained in this subsection shall be supplemental to any other
288	sanctions or penalties to which a pharmacist or nurse may otherwise be subject."
289	SECTION 3.
290	All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
