9 WHEREAS, he attended Georgia State College, now known as Savannah State College, and

10 was a proud and zealous alumnus, earning the distinction of a Diamond Life Member of his

11 alumni association; and

WHEREAS, he began his teaching career at Ballard Hudson High School (1949) in Macon, Georgia, as a Vocational Technical and Adult Education teacher and later earned a master's degree in Vocational Technical Education at Wayne State University and worked as the coordinator of the Cooperative Vocational Academic Education program at Northeast (Mark Smith) High School from 1969 to 1986; and

WHEREAS, he was a dedicated instructor, supporting many students and often traveling with them across several states to participate in various competitions and winning many awards, and he truly believed in the power of education and the importance of teaching; and

- 30 WHEREAS, Mr. Jordan leaves to cherish his memory his beloved and devoted wife, Leola;
- 31 children, Debra, John III, Darryl, Emmalyn, and Janet; grandchildren, Tamecia, Malaikla,
- 32 Sumayah, John IV, Brandi, Michael, Alonzo, Mallori, Brittani, Bria, Staci, and JaNia; and
- 33 great-grandchildren, Sonya, Ariana, Amari, David, and Alijah, and many cousins, nieces,
- 34 nephews, and family friends who affectionately called him "daddy" and "granddaddy."
