- 1 Commending Millie Jackson for her accomplishments as an entertainer; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Millie Jackson is a charismatic and multi-talented entertainer and music
- 4 industry icon whose often criticized career paved the way for many of today's forward female
- 5 recording artists and entertainers; and
- 6 WHEREAS, several years ago, she created, financed, directed, and starred in a hit musical
- 7 stage play that was based on one of her previous recordings, "Young Man, Older Woman";
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, her career was launched in a New York night club on a bet; winning the bet by
- 10 performing resulted in Millie's metamorphic rise from a fledgling performer to a
- 11 world-renown electrifying entertainer; and
- 12 WHEREAS, her debut album resulted in Millie being named "Most Promising Female
- 13 Vocalist" by a NATRA no defunct raid and record industry organization; the following year,
- 14 her single, "Hurts So Good," was featured in the Warner Brothers film, "Cleopatra Jones," and
- 15 the soundtrack album resulted in Millie winning "Best Female R&B Vocalists" honors from
- 16 Cash Box Magazine; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Millie went on to record seven more albums between two different labels:
- 18 Jive/Zomba Records, an English based label distributed by RCA Records, and the Georgia
- 19 based Ichiban Records; four albums and several singles were released during her tenure at
- 20 Jive/Zomba Records, with two of the singles reaching the national Top Ten R&B music
- 21 charts; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Millie has been dubbed the Mother of Hip Hop because of her 1980 recording,
- 23 "I Had to Say It"; this record session led to her being called on to do a Sprite commercial; and

24 WHEREAS, for the past several years, Millie has been doing her daily radio show on KKDA

- 25 in Dallas, Texas, from various locations around the country; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Millie was inspired to record again and decided to launch her own label and
- 27 record the types of songs and materials that made her the outspoken, sexually liberated Millie
- 28 Jackson that people loved and flocked to see.
- 29 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 30 the members of this body commend Millie Jackson for her accomplishments as an entertainer.
