## A RESOLUTION

Commending Clymonteen Livingston Jones for outstanding public service to her community; 1

2 and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Clymonteen Livingston Jones was raised in the small town of Hahira, Georgia,

4 and graduated from Lamar School of Nursing in 1953; she worked at University and St.

5 Joseph Hospitals before joining Talmadge Memorial Hospital in 1956; and

6 WHEREAS, in order to ensure that all nurses were treated equally regardless of race, Ms.

7 Jones met with the nursing director and asked that all of the nurses be referred to in the same

8 way, which won her the esteem of many of the doctors; and

9 WHEREAS, as one of the first two black registered nurses hired at Talmadge Memorial

10 Hospital, she not only helped set up the first units to receive patients but also later helped

11 create the first maximum security unit inside a hospital in Georgia to receive prisoners; and

12 WHEREAS, Ms. Jones and another nurse wrote the procedures and policies for the 13 maximum security unit, which were influenced by her own experiences with racism, and 14 made it a policy that the nurses would not know why a patient was incarcerated to avoid 15 potential prejudice in treatment; and

WHEREAS, she published this philosophy in a 1981 article in Corrections Today Magazine 16 17 titled, "Patients First, Prisoners Second"; and

18 WHEREAS, she became the first black head nurse of a unit in 1968 and was held in high 19 regard for performing her job exceptionally well as both a staff and head nurse; and

20 WHEREAS, she retired in 1986 and received a proclamation from Governor Joe Frank 21 Harris praising her work; and

- 22 WHEREAS, February's Black History Month often focuses on great leaders or fearless
- 23 protesters and overlooks the unsung quiet pioneers such as Ms. Jones who helped transform
- 24 the environment around them without fanfare; and
- 25 WHEREAS, it is abundantly fitting and proper that the outstanding accomplishments of this
- 26 remarkable and distinguished Georgian be appropriately recognized.
