## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Mrs. Dupe Atoki, the Director General of Consumer Protection Council
- 2 (CPC); and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Mrs. Dupe Atoki is a lawyer of over 35 years' experience in corporate and
- 4 human rights law; she graduated from the Ahmadu Bello University and was admitted to the
- 5 Nigerian Bar in 1978 and is also an alumnus of the Washington College of Law and Oxford
- 6 University, United Kingdom; and
- 7 WHEREAS, she has served Nigeria in many capacities, including being a member of several
- 8 presidential committees, a former Commissioner of the Nigerian National Human Rights
- 9 Commission, and currently, the Director General of the Consumer Protection Council (CPC);
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, at the continental level, she served as a legal consultant in the drafting of
- 12 several legal documents for the African Union and was a Commissioner of the African Union
- 13 Commission on Human and People's Rights; and
- 14 WHEREAS, she was a Special Rapporteur on Prisons and Places of Detention in Africa and
- 15 chaired the Committee for the Prevention of Torture in Africa; and
- 16 WHEREAS, she later rose to become the commission's chairperson, making her the first
- 17 Nigerian woman to head an African Union Organ; as chairperson of the commission, she did
- 18 not only transform its management, but she also eliminated the backlog of cases filed against
- 19 African governments and delays in its decision making; and
- 20 WHEREAS, for her significant contributions to peacekeeping in the realm of human rights
- 21 advocacy in Africa, Mrs. Atoki was conferred with the 2013 Gusi Peace Prize in Manila,
- 22 Philippines; the award is the Asian counterpart of the Nobel Peace Prize, making her the first
- 23 Nigerian and third African woman to receive it; and

24 WHEREAS, she has also received awards from the Open Society Foundation (OSF), the

- 25 Nigerian Bar Association Human Rights Institute (NBAHRI), the Pan African Lawyers
- 26 Union (PALU), and the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) in recognition of her
- 27 advocacy on human rights in the African Union (AU); and
- 28 WHEREAS, in 2014, she was recognized by her home state, the Kogi State Government,
- 29 which honored her as an outstanding woman of the state, while her community, the Kabba
- 30 Development Union, organized a civic reception for her in recognition of her achievements;
- 31 she was presented with a Plaque of Honour in Kabba by his Majesty, Obaro of Kabba, Oba
- 32 Dr. Michael Olobayo; and
- 33 WHEREAS, Mrs. Atoki, has demonstrated commitment and focus in the execution of her
- 34 assignments in the Consumer Protection Council and has taken giant strides towards
- 35 repositioning the agency for better performance.
- 36 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 37 the members of this body commend Mrs. Dupe Atoki for her protection of human rights in
- 38 Africa.
