A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Article 19 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2	relating to textbooks for elementary and secondary education, so as to require instructional
3	materials and content to be in digital or electronic format after a certain date; to require local
4	boards of education to provide wireless electronic devices for students to access instructional
5	materials and content; to revise provisions for purposes of conformity; to provide for a short
6	title; to provide for an effective date; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
7	laws; and for other purposes.
8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
9	SECTION 1.
10	This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Digital Classroom Act."
11	SECTION 2.
12	Article 19 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
13	textbooks for elementary and secondary education, is amended as follows:
14	"ARTICLE 19
15	20-2-1010.
16	(a) The State Board of Education is authorized to prescribe, by regulation, the definition
17	of the term 'textbook' 'digital instructional materials and content' to include but not be
18	limited to systematically designed material in any medium, whether print, nonprint, or
19	digital including any digital instructional materials and content and any computer
20	hardware, software, and technical equipment necessary to support such material digital
21	materials and content, that constitutes the principal source of study for a state funded
22	course and to prescribe the textbooks to be used in the various grades in the public schools
23	of this state, including the elementary grades and high school grades. The state board may
24	provide, by regulation, for multiple listings of textbooks digital instructional materials and

- 25 <u>content</u> for use in the various grades and may, in its discretion, authorize the local school
- superintendents to exercise a choice as between textbooks digital instructional materials
- 27 <u>and content</u> so listed or adopted for any particular grade.
- (b) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to exempt computer hardware orrelated equipment acquired by the state from competitive bidding.

The State Board of Education may provide for the selection and purchase of free textbooks digital instructional materials and content either by multiple listings or uniform adoption or by any other method that will enable the acquiring of acceptable books digital instructional materials and content at the lowest possible costs, provided such adoption or multiple listings shall in no event constitute a binding contract until ratified in writing by the state board. None of the books digital instructional materials and content so purchased shall contain anything of a partisan or sectarian nature.

(a) The State Board of Education shall select a committee or committees of educators
actually engaged in public school work in this state to examine textbooks digital
instructional materials and content and make recommendations thereon to the state board.
Such committee or committees shall consist of such number of educators as the state board
may deem advisable, not exceeding five in each instance. They shall serve for such time
and for such duties as the state board may prescribe and shall receive such compensation
as may be fixed by the state board.

- (b) In addition to any other method of textbook <u>digital instructional materials and content</u>
 selection, the State Board of Education shall add to the approved list of textbooks <u>digital</u>
 <u>instructional materials and content</u> for use in the public schools of this state any textbook
 or series of textbooks <u>digital instructional materials and content</u> requested in writing by:
- 50 (1) The superintendents of five or more different school systems; or
- (2) Twenty or more teachers from at least 20 different school systems who teach and are
 certified to teach the courses encompassed by the textbook digital instructional materials
 and content requested,
- if the requisite number of requests for the specified textbook digital instructional materials and content are received within any 365 day period. A textbook Digital instructional materials and content so required to be added to the approved list shall be added within 30 days following the receipt by the state board of the requisite number of requests. No designation shall be included upon the approved list which indicates the manner in which any textbook was digital instructional materials and content were added to the list. Other

(a) The State Board of Education is authorized and directed to inaugurate and administer
a system of free textbooks <u>digital instructional materials and content</u> for the public schools
of this state. The state board shall have authority to promulgate and enforce such rules and
regulations as may be necessary for that purpose.

70 (b) All hardbound or softbound textbooks, library books, and media materials digital 71 instructional materials and content and any computer hardware, software, and technical 72 equipment necessary to support such digital materials and content purchased by local units 73 of administration with state Quality Basic Education Program funds or any other means of 74 acquisition shall may remain the property of the local unit purchasing or acquiring them. 75 Assistive technology devices and digital versions of textbooks that are acquired may 76 remain the property of the student; provided, however, that this shall not be construed to 77 violate any contracts or copyright laws. Each local unit of administration shall establish 78 such policies as it deems necessary for the care and protection of its textbooks digital 79 instructional materials and content; computer hardware, software, and technical equipment 80 necessary to support such digital materials and content;; library books;; and media 81 materials as a condition to receiving all or part of the state contributed Quality Basic 82 Education Program funds allotted to the local unit. Such policies may include any of the 83 following sanctions against a pupil who fails or refuses to pay for a any lost or damaged 84 textbook, digital instructional materials and content; computer hardware, software, and technical equipment necessary to support such digital materials and content; library book; 85 86 or media material at the replacement cost:

Refusal to issue or make available any additional textbooks, digital instructional
 materials and content, any computer hardware, software, and technical equipment
 necessary to support such digital materials and content, any library books, or any media
 materials until restitution is made; or

91 (2) Withholding of all grade cards, diplomas, or certificates of progress until restitution92 is made.

No local unit of administration shall require any pupil or parent to purchase any textbook,
 digital instructional materials and content; computer hardware, software, and technical
 equipment necessary to support such digital materials and content; library book; or media

- 106 (a) On and after July 1, 2020, all instructional materials and content purchased by a local
- 107 <u>board of education pursuant to this article shall be in digital or electronic format.</u>
- 108 (b) On and after July 1, 2020, each local board of education shall provide a laptop, tablet,
- 109 <u>or other wireless electronic device to each of its students for use as the principal source of</u>
- 110 reading or accessing instructional materials and content."
- 111 SECTION 3.
- 112 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2020.
- 113 SECTION 4.
- 114 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
