- 4 owned by or leased to a public institution of postsecondary education; to provide for a

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

9 Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,

10 relating to carrying and possession of firearms, is amended in subsection (c) of Code Section

11 16-11-127.1, relating to carrying weapons within school safety zones, at school functions,

or on a bus or other transportation furnished by a school, by deleting "or" at the end of

paragraph (17), by replacing the period with "; or" at the end of paragraph (18), and by

14 adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

"(19) Any person who is 18 years of age or older or currently enrolled in classes on the campus in question and carrying, possessing, or having under such person's control an electroshock weapon while in or on any building or real property owned by or leased to such public technical school, vocational school, college or university or other public institution of postsecondary education; provided, however, that, if such person makes use of such electroshock weapon, such use shall be in defense of self or others. The exemption under this paragraph shall apply only to such person in regard to such electroshock weapon. As used in this paragraph, the term 'electroshock weapon' means any commercially available device that is powered by electrical charging units and designed exclusively to be capable of incapacitating a person by electrical charge, including, but not limited to, a stun gun or taser as defined in subsection (a) of Code

Section 16-11-106."

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
