## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia

Annotated, relating to carrying and possession of firearms, so as to authorize certain persons
who are qualified retired law enforcement officers to carry a handgun anywhere within this

4 state; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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### **SECTION 1.**

Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
relating to carrying and possession of firearms, is amended by revising subsection (c) of
Code Section 16-11-130, relating to exemptions from Code Sections 16-11-126 through
16-11-127.2, as follows:

11 "(c) Code Sections 16-11-126 through 16-11-127.2 shall not apply to or affect any:

12 (1) Sheriff, retired sheriff, deputy sheriff, or retired deputy sheriff if such retired sheriff 13 or deputy sheriff is eligible to receive or is receiving benefits under the Peace Officers' Annuity and Benefit Fund provided under Chapter 17 of Title 47, the Sheriffs' Retirement 14 15 Fund of Georgia provided under Chapter 16 of Title 47, or any other public retirement 16 system established under the laws of this state for service as a law enforcement officer; (2) Member of the Georgia State Patrol, or agent of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, 17 or retired member of the Georgia State Patrol, or <u>retired</u> agent of the Georgia Bureau of 18 19 Investigation if such retired member or agent is receiving benefits under the Employees' 20 Retirement System;

(3) Full-time law enforcement chief executive engaging in the management of a county,
municipal, state, state authority, or federal law enforcement agency in the State of
Georgia, including any college or university law enforcement chief executive that who
is registered or certified by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council;
or retired law enforcement chief executive that who formerly managed a county,
municipal, state, state authority, or federal law enforcement agency in the State of
Georgia, including any college or university law enforcement chief executive that who

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was registered or certified at the time of his or her retirement by the Georgia Peace
Officer Standards and Training Council, if such retired law enforcement chief executive
is receiving benefits under the Peace Officers' Annuity and Benefit Fund provided under
Chapter 17 of Title 47 or is retired in good standing and receiving benefits from a county,
municipal, State of Georgia, state authority, or federal retirement system; or

33 (4) Police officer of any county, municipal, state, state authority, or federal law enforcement agency in the State of Georgia, including any college or university police 34 officer that who is registered or certified by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and 35 36 Training Council, or retired police officer of any county, municipal, state, state authority, or federal law enforcement agency in the State of Georgia, including any college or 37 university police officer that who was registered or certified at the time of his or her 38 retirement by the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council, if such retired 39 employee police officer is receiving benefits under the Peace Officers' Annuity and 40 Benefit Fund provided under Chapter 17 of Title 47 or is retired in good standing and 41 receiving benefits from a county, municipal, State of Georgia, state authority, or federal 42 43 retirement system; or

- 44 (5) Person who is a citizen of this state and who is a qualified retired law enforcement
   45 officer as provided for under the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004, 18
- 46 <u>U.S.C. Sections 926B and 926C</u>.

In addition, any such sheriff, retired sheriff, deputy sheriff, retired deputy sheriff, active or retired law enforcement chief executive, <u>person who is a qualified retired law enforcement</u> officer as provided for in paragraph (5) of this subsection, or other law enforcement officer referred to in this subsection shall be authorized to carry a handgun on or off duty anywhere within the this state, and the provisions of Code Sections 16-11-126 through 16-11-127.2 shall not apply to the carrying of such firearms."

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### **SECTION 2.**

54 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
