The Senate Committee on Judiciary offered the following substitute to HB 67:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to crimes and offenses, so as to designate the existing crime of hijacking a motor vehicle as being in the first degree and create a new crime of hijacking a motor vehicle in the second degree; to provide for penalties; to change provisions relating to burglary in the second degree involving a vehicle; to amend the Official Code of Georgia Annotated to provide for conforming cross-references; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

PART I

SECTION 1-1.

11 Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to crimes and offenses, is 12 amended by revising subsections (b) through (d) of Code Section 16-5-44.1, relating to 13 hijacking a motor vehicle, as follows:

- 14 "(b)(1) A person commits the offense of hijacking a motor vehicle in the first degree
 15 when such person while in possession of a firearm or weapon obtains a motor vehicle
 16 from the person an individual or the presence of another individual by force and violence
 17 or intimidation or attempts or conspires to do so.
- (2) A person commits the offense of hijacking a motor vehicle in the second degree when
 such person obtains a motor vehicle from an individual without his or her consent or from
 the immediate presence of another individual without his or her consent or attempts or
 conspires to do so.
- (c)(1) A person convicted of the offense of hijacking a motor vehicle in the first degree
 shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than ten nor more than 20 years and a fine
 of not less than \$10,000.00 nor more than \$100,000.00, provided that any person who has
 previously committed an offense under the laws of the United States or of Georgia or of

- 26any of the several states or of any foreign nation recognized by the United States which27if committed in Georgia would have constituted the offense of hijacking a motor vehicle28shall be punished by imprisonment for life and a fine of not less than \$100,000.00 nor29more than \$500,000.00. The punishment imposed pursuant to this paragraph shall not be30deferred, suspended, or probated. For purposes of this subsection paragraph, the term31'state' shall include the District of Columbia and any territory, possession, or dominion32of the United States.
- 33 (2) A person convicted of the offense of hijacking a motor vehicle in the second degree 34 shall be punished upon a first conviction by imprisonment for not less than one nor more 35 than ten years and a fine of not more than \$5,000.00. Upon a second conviction for hijacking a motor vehicle in the second degree, a person shall be punished by 36 imprisonment for not less than three nor more than 15 years and a fine of not more than 37 \$5,000.00. Upon a third or subsequent conviction of hijacking a motor vehicle in the 38 39 second degree, a person shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than five nor more than 20 years and a fine of not more than \$5,000.00. 40
- (d) The offense of hijacking a motor vehicle <u>in the first degree</u> shall be considered a
 separate offense and shall not merge with any other offense; and the punishment prescribed
 by subsection (c) of this Code section shall not be deferred, suspended, or probated."
- 44 SECTION 1-2.
 45 Said title is further amended by revising subsection (c) of Code Section 16-7-1, relating to
 46 burglary, as follows:
- 47 "(c) A person commits the offense of burglary in the second degree when, without authority and with the intent to commit a felony or theft therein, he or she enters or remains 48 49 within an occupied, unoccupied, or vacant building, structure, vehicle, railroad car, 50 watercraft, or aircraft. A person who commits the offense of burglary in the second degree shall be guilty of a felony and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment 51 for not less than one nor more than five years. Upon the second and all subsequent 52 53 convictions for burglary in the second degree, the defendant shall be guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than eight years." 54

PART II SECTION 2-1.

57 The Official Code of Georgia Annotated is amended by replacing "hijacking a motor vehicle"
58 with "hijacking a motor vehicle in the first degree" in the following:

- (1) Subparagraph (a)(12)(G) of Code Section 15-11-2, relating to definitions for the 59 60 Juvenile Code; (2) Subparagraph (b)(1)(L) of Code Section 15-11-505, relating to use of detention 61 62 assessments to determine if detention is warranted and "serious delinquent act" defined; (3) Paragraph (6) of subsection (a) of Code Section 17-6-1, relating to where offenses 63 are bailable, procedure, schedule of bails, and appeal bonds; and 64 65 (4) Subparagraph (a)(2)(C) of Code Section 17-6-12, relating to the discretion of the court to release person charged with a crime on person's own recognizance only.

PART III

SECTION 3-1.

Code Section 16-11-131 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to possession 69 70 of a firearm by convicted felons and first-offender probationers, is amended by revising 71 subsection (e) as follows:

72 "(e) As used in this Code section, the term 'forcible felony' means any felony which 73 involves the use or threat of physical force or violence against any person and further 74 includes, without limitation, murder; murder in the second degree; burglary in any degree; 75 robbery; armed robbery; home invasion in any degree; kidnapping; hijacking of an aircraft 76 or hijacking a motor vehicle in the first degree; aggravated stalking; rape; aggravated child 77 molestation; aggravated sexual battery; arson in the first degree; the manufacturing, 78 transporting, distribution, or possession of explosives with intent to kill, injure, or 79 intimidate individuals or destroy a public building; terroristic threats; or acts of treason or insurrection." 80

SECTION 3-2.

Title 17 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to criminal procedure, is 82 amended by revising division (a)(11)(A)(vi) of Code Section 17-7-130, relating to 83 84 proceedings upon plea of mental incompetence to stand trial, as follows:

"(vi) Hijacking of a motor vehicle in the first degree or hijacking an aircraft;"

SECTION 3-3.

- Said title is further amended by revising paragraph (6) of subsection (a) of Code Section 87 17-10-9.1, relating to voluntary surrender to county jail or correctional institution, as follows: 88 89 "(6) Aircraft hijacking and hijacking of a motor vehicle in the first degree;"
