# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Chapter 5 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to crimes
2	against the person, so as to repeal an enhanced penalty relating to battery against a person
3	65 years of age or older; to revise a definition relative to the protection of disabled adults and
4	elder persons; to amend Code Section 30-5-4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
5	relating to reporting of need for protective services, manner and contents of report, immunity
6	from civil or criminal liability, and privileged communications, so as to include notaries
7	public as a mandatory reporter for abuse of disabled adults and elder persons; to amend Code
8	Section 31-7-12.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to unlicensed personal
9	care homes, so as to authorize inspections of unlicensed personal care homes by a local or
10	state law enforcement agency; to amend Code Section 45-17-8 of the Official Code of
11	Georgia Annotated, relating to powers and duties of notaries public generally, so as to require
12	notaries to report abuse of disabled adults or elder persons; to provide for related matters; to
13	provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
15	SECTION 1.
16	Chapter 5 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to crimes against
17	the person, is amended in Code Section 16-5-23.1, relating to battery, by revising subsections
18	(c), (j), (k), and (l) as follows:
19	"(c) Except as provided in subsections (d) through $\frac{(h)}{(k)}$ of this Code section, a person who
20	commits the offense of battery is guilty of a misdemeanor."
21	"(j) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (e) and paragraph (2) of subsection (f) of
22	this Code section, any person who commits the offense of battery against a person who is
23	65 years of age or older shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished for a misdemeanor of
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	a high and aggravated nature.

to be licensed under Code Section 31-7-3, relating to long-term care facilities, or Code

Section 31-7-12.2, relating to assisted living communities, or Code Section 31-7-12,
relating to personal care homes, or who is required to be licensed pursuant to Code Section
31-7-151 or 31-7-173, relating to home health care and hospices, who commits the offense
of battery against a person who is admitted to or receiving services from such facility,
person, or entity shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by imprisonment for not less
than one nor more than five years, or a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both.

33 (<del>)</del>(<u>k</u>) Any person who commits the offense of battery against a sports official while such 34 sports official is officiating an amateur contest or while such sports official is on or exiting 35 the property where he or she will officiate or has completed officiating an amateur contest 36 shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished for a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated 37 nature. For purposes of this Code section, the term 'sports official' means any person who 38 officiates, umpires, or referees an amateur contest at the collegiate, elementary or 39 secondary school, or recreational level."

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#### **SECTION 2.**

41 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 16-5-100, relating to definitions relative to
42 the protection of elder persons, by revising paragraph (6) as follows:

"(6) 'Exploit' means illegally or improperly using a disabled adult or elder person or that
person's resources through undue influence, coercion, harassment, duress, deception, false
representation, false pretense, or other similar means for one's own or another person's
profit or advantage, including, but not limited to, the illegal taking of resources belonging
to a disabled adult or elder person when access to the resources was obtained, either in
whole or in part, due to the disabled adult's or elder person's mental or physical
incapacity."

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#### **SECTION 3.**

Code Section 30-5-4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to reporting of need 51 for protective services, manner and contents of report, immunity from civil or criminal 52 53 liability, and privileged communications, is amended by revising subsection (a) as follows: 54 ''(a)(1)(A) The following persons having reasonable cause to believe that a disabled adult or elder person has been the victim of abuse, other than by accidental means, or 55 56 has been neglected or exploited shall report or cause reports to be made in accordance with the provisions of this Code section: 57 58 (i) Any person required to report child abuse as provided in subsection (c) of Code

60 (ii) Physical therapists;

61 (iii) Occupational therapists;

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62	(iv) Day-care personnel;
63	(v) Coroners;
64	(vi) Medical examiners;
65	(vii) Emergency medical services personnel, as such term is defined in Code Section
66	31-11-49;
67	(viii) Any person who has been certified as an emergency medical technician, cardiac
68	technician, paramedic, or first responder pursuant to Chapter 11 of Title 31;
69	(ix) Employees of a public or private agency engaged in professional health related
70	services to elder persons or disabled adults; and
71	(x) Clergy members; and
72	(xi) Notaries public.
73	(B) Any employee of a financial institution or investment company having reasonable
74	cause to believe that a disabled adult or elder person has been exploited shall report or
75	cause reports to be made in accordance with the provisions of this Code section;
76	provided, however, that this obligation shall not apply to any employee of a financial
77	institution or investment company while that employee is acting as a fiduciary, but only
78	for such assets that the employee is holding or managing in a fiduciary capacity.
79	(C) When the person having a reasonable cause to believe that a disabled adult or elder
80	person is in need of protective services performs services as a member of the staff of
81	a hospital, social agency, financial institution, or similar facility, such person shall
82	notify the person in charge of the facility and such person or that person's designee shall
83	report or cause reports to be made in accordance with the provisions of this Code
84	section.
85	(2) Any other person having a reasonable cause to believe that a disabled adult or elder
86	person is in need of protective services or has been the victim of abuse, neglect, or
87	exploitation may report such information as provided in this Code section."
88	<b>SECTION 4.</b>
89	Code Section 31-7-12.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to unlicensed
90	personal care homes, is amended by revising subsection (g) and by adding a new subsection
91	to read as follows:
92	"(g) Upon the designation by the department and with the consent of any local or state law
93	enforcement agency, such law enforcement agency may act as an agent of the department
94	in conducting inspections of unlicensed personal care homes required to be licensed under
95	this chapter. Any such inspections shall only be conducted by a law enforcement agency
96	if the law enforcement agency is already on site in the course of investigating a complaint
97	or performing other law enforcement duties and has consent or a warrant to enter the home.

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98	Law enforcement agencies shall not be authorized to recoup any of the costs of inspections
99	performed pursuant to this subsection from the department.
100	(h) Any person who owns or operates a personal care home in violation of subsection (b)
101	of Code Section 31-7-12 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor for a first violation, unless such
102	violation is in conjunction with abuse, neglect, or exploitation as defined in Code Section
103	<del>30-5-3</del> a violation of Article 8 of Chapter 5 of Title 16, in which case such person shall be
104	guilty of a felony and, upon conviction, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than
105	one nor more than five years. Upon conviction for a second or subsequent such violation,
106	such person shall be guilty of a felony and, upon conviction, shall be punished by
107	imprisonment for not less than one nor more than ten years."
108	SECTION 5.
109	Code Section 45-17-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to powers and
110	duties of notaries public generally, is amended by adding a new subsection to read as
111	follows:
112	"(g) A notary who has reasonable cause to believe that a disabled adult or elder person has
113	been the victim of abuse, other than by accidental means, or has been neglected or
114	exploited shall report or cause reports to be made in accordance with the provisions of
115	Code Section 30-5-4."
116	SECTION 6.

- 117 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law118 without such approval.
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### **SECTION 7.**

120 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
