The House Committee on Health and Human Services offers the following substitute to SB 163:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Article 9 of Chapter 4 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 2 relating to temporary assistance for needy families, so as to prohibit the use of electronic 3 benefit transfer cards in certain retail establishments; to prohibit the use of electronic benefit 4 transfer cards by recipients for certain purposes; to provide for reports of suspected abuse; to provide for investigations; to provide for sanctions; to provide for rules and regulations; 5 to require the issuance of electronic benefit transfer cards; to provide for revisions to the state 6 7 plan; to provide for a report; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA: 9 10 **SECTION 1.** Article 9 of Chapter 4 of Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 11 temporary assistance for needy families, is amended by revising Code Section 49-4-189, 12 13 which is reserved, to read as follows: "49-4-189. 14

(a)(1) The following establishments shall not accept cash assistance, provided through
an electronic benefit transfer card, for any transaction in such establishment:

17 (A) A liquor store, which shall be defined as an establishment of a retail dealer in

18 distilled spirits licensed pursuant to Chapter 4 of Title 3; or

19 (B) A retail establishment which provides adult oriented entertainment in which

- 20 performers disrobe or perform in an unclothed state for entertainment.
- 21 (2) The establishments listed in paragraph (1) of this subsection shall also prevent access
- 22 to cash assistance through any electronic fund transaction in an automated teller machine
- 23 <u>or point-of-sale device located in such establishment.</u>
- 24 (b) On and after April 1, 2014, a recipient shall not use and a retail establishment shall not
- 25 <u>accept cash assistance, through an electronic benefit transfer card or any other means, for</u>
- 26 <u>the purchase of the following products or services:</u>

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27	(1) Lottery tickets;
28	(2) Alcoholic beverages;
29	(3) Tobacco products;
30	(4) Pornographic materials:
31	(5) Firearms and ammunition;
32	(6) Vacation services;
33	(7) Tattoos or body piercings;
34	(8) Gambling;
35	(9) Gift cards; or
36	(10) Payment to any government entity for fines, fees, bail, or bail bonds.
37	(c)(1) No later than April 1, 2014, the department shall establish a new or continue to
38	operate an existing toll-free telephone number and a website to receive reports of
39	suspected violations of this Code section. The toll-free telephone number may include
40	an intake recording and shall allow the caller to provide the date and time of the incident,
41	the name and location of the retail establishment, and the details of the incident. The
42	website shall allow the individual to provide the date and time of the incident, the name
43	and location of the retail establishment, and the details of the incident and shall also allow
44	the individual to upload one or more photos relating to the incident. Such caller or
45	individual, at his or her discretion, may also provide his or her name and contact
46	information.
47	(2)(A) On and after April 1, 2014, any retail establishment that accepts electronic
48	benefit transfer cards for cash assistance shall:
49	(i) Register with the department and provide such information as the board deems
50	necessary to enforce this Code section;
51	(ii) Retain receipts, which may include electronic journal receipts, of cash assistance
52	transactions for at least 90 days from the date of the transaction; and
53	(iii) Post in a prominent location at each entrance a sign as provided by the
54	department, but in no event smaller than 6 inches by 8 inches in size, prohibiting the
55	use of cash assistance for the products and services listed in subsection (b) of this
56	Code section. The sign shall include the toll-free telephone number and website
57	address established pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subsection which may be utilized
58	to report suspected incidents of abuse of such prohibitions. This division shall stand
59	repealed on December 31, 2017.
60	(B) This paragraph shall not apply to a retail establishment that does not accept
61	electronic benefit transfer cards for cash assistance.

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62 (3) The department shall monitor the incidents reported pursuant to paragraph (1) of this 63 subsection no less than semiweekly and shall refer such incidents to investigators within 64 the department. Investigators shall be authorized to investigate establishments and 65 recipients for violations of this Code section. 66 (d)(1) A retail establishment that violates any provision of this Code section may be 67 subject to penalties established by the department, including, but not limited to, fines or 68 suspension or prohibition from accepting cash assistance transactions. 69 (2) A recipient who uses cash assistance in violation of subsection (b) of this Code 70 section may be subject to sanctions pursuant to Code Section 49-4-185. 71 (3) Any fine, sanction, or penalty imposed for a violation of this Code section may be 72 appealed by the retail establishment or recipient sanctioned in accordance with the 73 administrative hearing process established pursuant to paragraph (8) of subsection (b) of 74 Code Section 49-4-183. 75 (4) It is the intent of the General Assembly that any fines imposed for violations of this 76 Code section are applied to offset the costs of enforcing the provisions of this Code 77 section. 78 (e) On and after the effective date of this Code section, neither the board nor the 79 department shall enter into any contracts or agreements with entities for the provision of 80 cash assistance to recipients under this article unless such contracts or agreements fully comply with the requirements of this Code section. Neither the board nor the department 81 82 shall extend any contracts or agreements with entities for the provision of cash assistance 83 to recipients under this article unless such contracts or agreements fully comply with the 84 requirements of this Code section. 85 (f) On and after the effective date of this Code section, but in no event later than April 1, 86 2014, the board shall ensure that cash assistance is provided to recipients in accordance 87 with the following requirements: 88 (1) Only through the issuance of electronic benefit transfer cards; 89 (2) At the discretion of the board, include on the card only such other public assistance 90 benefits which are specific to the recipient; 91 (3) Include a photograph on the card of the recipient to whom the card is issued; 92 (4) Require such recipient's signature for use of the card; 93 (5) Print on the card the products and services which are prohibited purchases pursuant 94 to subsection (b) of this Code section and the toll-free telephone number and website 95 established or operated pursuant to subsection (c) of this Code section; 96 (6) Provide a mechanism to prevent use of cards at automated teller machines; 97 (7) Provide a mechanism to prevent the purchase of prohibited products and services 98 pursuant to subsection (b) of this Code section;

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99	(8) Shall not be provided to a recipient pursuant to a commercial credit card, charge card,
100	or debit card; and
101	(9) Shall be attached to an account of transaction which may be audited by the board.
102	(g) No later than December 31, 2013, the department shall provide a report to the Speaker
103	of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate regarding the
104	implementation of this Code section and identifying other methods that could be
105	implemented to ensure that the provisions of this Code section are enforced.
106	(h) The board shall take appropriate steps, if necessary, to revise the state plan in order to
107	effectuate the requirements of this Code section.
108	(i) The board shall establish and enforce rules and regulations in accordance with this
109	Code section to prevent the improper use of cash assistance in violation of this Code
110	section. Reserved."
111	SECTION 2.
112	This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
113	without such approval.
114	SECTION 3.
115	All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
