- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (a) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, the Secretary shall issue a permit 17 within a reasonable time to a person who the Secretary finds:
- 18 (1) is an adult;
- 19 (2) (i) has not been convicted of a felony or of a misdemeanor for which 20 a sentence of imprisonment for more than 1 year has been imposed; or
- 21 (ii) if convicted of a crime described in item (i) of this item, has been

- pardoned or has been granted relief under 18 U.S.C. § 925(c); 1 2 has not been convicted of a crime involving the possession, use, or 3 distribution of a controlled dangerous substance; 4 is not presently an alcoholic, addict, or habitual user of a controlled (4) dangerous substance unless the habitual use of the controlled dangerous substance is under 5 legitimate medical direction; 6 7 except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, has successfully 8 completed prior to application and each renewal, a firearms training course approved by 9 the Secretary that includes: 10 (i) for an initial application, a minimum of 16 hours of 1. instruction by a qualified handgun instructor; or 11 12 2. for a renewal application, 8 hours of instruction by a 13 qualified handgun instructor; classroom instruction on: 14 (ii) 1. State firearm law; 15 16 2. home firearm safety; and 17 3. handgun mechanisms and operation; and a firearms qualification component that demonstrates the 18 applicant's proficiency and use of the firearm; and 19 20 (6) based on an investigation[: 21has not exhibited a propensity for violence or instability that may 22reasonably render the person's possession of a handgun a danger to the person or to another[; and 23 24(ii) has good and substantial reason to wear, carry, or transport a 25handgun, such as a finding that the permit is necessary as a reasonable precaution against 26 apprehended danger].
- 27 (b) An applicant for a permit is not required to complete a certified firearms 28 training course under subsection (a) of this section if the applicant:
- 29 (1) is a law enforcement officer or a person who is retired in good standing 30 from service with a law enforcement agency of the United States, the State, or any local 31 law enforcement agency in the State;

1 is a member, retired member, or honorably discharged member of the (2)2 armed forces of the United States or the National Guard: 3 (3)is a qualified handgun instructor; or 4 **(4)** has completed a firearms training course approved by the Secretary. An applicant under the age of 30 years is qualified only if the Secretary finds 5 6 that the applicant has not been: 7 committed to a detention, training, or correctional institution for (1) 8 juveniles for longer than 1 year after an adjudication of delinquency by a juvenile court; or 9 (2)adjudicated delinquent by a juvenile court for: an act that would be a crime of violence if committed by an adult; 10 (i) 11 (ii) an act that would be a felony in this State if committed by an 12 adult; or an act that would be a misdemeanor in this State that carries a 13 (iii) statutory penalty of more than 2 years if committed by an adult. 14 15 (d) The Secretary may issue a handgun qualification license, without an 16 additional application or fee, to a person who: 17 (1) meets the requirements for issuance of a permit under this section; and does not have a handgun qualification license issued under § 18 (2)19 5–117.1 of this title. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 20 21October 1, 2018.
