4 5 6 7 8	FOR the purpose of requiring that an order issued by the Governor during a state of emergency or catastrophic health emergency authorize a religious organization to operate to the same extent that or to a greater extent than organizations providing essential services are authorized to operate; and generally relating to the operation of religious organizations under emergency orders.

19 20	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
21	Article – Public Safety
22	14–301.

1	(b) "Alternate care site" means an area that:
2	(1) (i) is not located on a health care facility's premises; or
3 4 5	(ii) is located on a health care facility's premises in an area no typically used to provide medical services, nursing services, or other health-related services; and
6	(2) is used by a licensed health care facility:
7 8	(i) to provide medical services, nursing services, or other health-related services during a declared state of emergency; and
9	(ii) that has access to an emergency electrical power generator.
10 11	(c) "Energy emergency" means a situation in which the health, safety, or welfard of the public is threatened by an actual or impending acute shortage in energy resources.
12 13 14	(D) "ESSENTIAL SERVICE" MEANS A SERVICE THAT IS NECESSARY AND VITAL TO THE HEALTH AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC DURING A DECLARED STATE OF EMERGENCY.
15 16	[(d)] (E) "Health care facility" has the meaning stated in § 19–114 of the Health – General Article.
17	[(e)] (F) "Public emergency" means:
18 19 20 21	(1) a situation in which three or more individuals are at the same time and in the same place engaged in tumultuous conduct that leads to the commission of unlawful acts that disturb the public peace or cause the unlawful destruction or damage of public or private property;
22	(2) a crisis, disaster, riot, or catastrophe; or
23	(3) an energy emergency.

25 26 27 28 29	(b) After proclaiming a state of emergency, the Governor may, SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, promulgate reasonable orders, rules, or regulations that the Governor considers necessary to protect life and property or calculated effectively to control and terminate the public emergency in the emergency area, including orders rules or regulations to:

- 3 1 (1) control traffic, including public and private transportation, in the 2 emergency area; 3 (2)designate specific zones in the emergency area in which the occupancy and use of buildings and vehicles may be controlled; 4 control the movement of individuals or vehicles into, in, or from the 5 (3)6 designated zones; 7 control places of amusement and places of assembly; (4) control individuals on public streets; 8 (5)9 establish curfews: (6) 10 control the sale, transportation, and use of alcoholic beverages; (7)11 control the possession, sale, carrying, and use of firearms, other (8)12 dangerous weapons, and ammunition; 13 control the storage, use, and transportation of explosives or flammable materials or liquids considered to be dangerous to public safety, including "Molotov 14 cocktails"; and 15 16 authorize the use of alternate care sites. (10)17 **(E)** AN ORDER, A RULE, OR A REGULATION PROMULGATED UNDER **(1)** 18 THIS SECTION SHALL AUTHORIZE A RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATION TO OPERATE AND 19 ENGAGE IN RELIGIOUS SERVICES TO THE SAME EXTENT THAT OR TO A GREATER 20 EXTENT THAN ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDING ESSENTIAL SERVICES ARE AUTHORIZED 21TO OPERATE. 22 **(2)** THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT THE 23STATE OR A LOCAL GOVERNMENT FROM REQUIRING A RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATION 24TO COMPLY WITH A NEUTRAL, GENERALLY APPLICABLE LAW OR REGULATION. 25 14-3A-01.
- "Catastrophic health emergency" means a situation in which extensive loss of 27 life or serious disability is threatened imminently because of exposure to a deadly agent. 28


In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

"Deadly agent" means: 29 (c)

(a)

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- 1 (1) anthrax, ebola, plague, smallpox, tularemia, or other bacterial, fungal, 2 rickettsial, or viral agent, biological toxin, or other biological agent capable of causing 3 extensive loss of life or serious disability;
- 4 (2) mustard gas, nerve gas, or other chemical agent capable of causing 5 extensive loss of life or serious disability; or
- 6 (3) radiation at levels capable of causing extensive loss of life or serious 7 disability.
- 8 **(D)** "ESSENTIAL SERVICE" MEANS A SERVICE THAT IS NECESSARY AND 9 VITAL TO THE HEALTH AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC DURING A CATASTROPHIC 10 HEALTH EMERGENCY.
- 11 **[**(d)**] (E)** "Exposure to a deadly agent" means a threat to human health caused 12 by the release, distribution, or transmission of a deadly agent in:
- 13 (1) this State; or
- 14 (2) another jurisdiction because of movement into the State of the deadly agent or of individuals exposed to the deadly agent.
- 16 [(e)] **(F)** "Health care provider" means:
- 17 (1) a health care facility as defined in § 19–114(d)(1) of the 18 Health General Article;
- 19 (2) a health care practitioner as defined in § 19–114(e) of the 20 Health General Article; and
- 21 (3) an individual licensed or certified as an emergency medical services 22 provider under § 13–516 of the Education Article.
- 23 [(f)] (G) "Secretary" means the Secretary of Health.

- 25 (a) After the Governor issues a proclamation under this subtitle, the Governor 26 may, SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, issue the orders authorized in this 27 section.
- 28 (b) (1) The Governor may order the Secretary or other designated official to:
- 29 (i) seize immediately anything needed to respond to the medical consequences of the catastrophic health emergency; and

  4 PROVIDING ESSENTIAL SERVICES ARE AUTHORIZED TO OPERATE.
- 5 (2) THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT THE 6 STATE OR A LOCAL GOVERNMENT FROM REQUIRING A RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATION TO COMPLY WITH A NEUTRAL, GENERALLY APPLICABLE LAW OR REGULATION.
