SENATE BILL NO. 172

98TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Reported from the Committee on Education, March 11, 2015, with recommendation that the Senate Committee Substitute do pass. ADRIANE D. CROUSE, Secretary.

AN ACT

To amend chapter 170, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to establishment of a career and technical education certificate.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 170, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 170.029, to read as follows:

170.029. 1. The state board of education shall establish minimum 2 graduation requirements for a career and technical education (CTE) 3 high school certificate. Students entering high school in the 2016-17 4 school year and thereafter shall be eligible to earn a CTE certificate. 5 A CTE certificate shall be a high school graduation certificate that 6 confers the same benefits for students that are conferred by any other 7 high school certificate meeting graduation requirements established by 8 the state board of education.

9 2. A CTE certificate shall be based on requirements designed to 10 provide students with technical skills and core academic skills and 11 shall demonstrate that the student is ready for a career in a technical 12 field.

3. Curriculum, programs of study, and course offerings shall be determined by the local school district based on the needs and interests of the students in the district. The state board of education shall work in cooperation with individual school districts with the goal of students having access to a minimum offering of six vocational areas of study. An effort shall be made by the local district to offer programs of study relating to as many vocational career paths as economically feasible to students in the district. In establishing curriculum requirements, the **SCS SB 172**

district may incorporate standards for industry-recognized

234. The department of elementary and secondary education shall promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration 2425of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in 26section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to 27all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 28536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of 29the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 30 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule 31 32 are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2015, shall 33 34 be invalid and void.
