AN ACT

To amend chapter 170, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to establishment of a career and technical education diploma.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 170, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 170.029, to read as follows:

170.029. 1. The state board of education shall establish minimum

- 2 graduation requirements for a career and technical education (CTE)
- 3 high school diploma. Students entering high school in the 2016-17
- 4 school year and thereafter shall be eligible to earn a CTE diploma. A
- 5 CTE diploma shall be a high school graduation diploma that confers the
- 6 same benefits for students that are conferred by any other high school
- 7 diploma meeting graduation requirements established by the state
- 8 board of education.
- 9 2. A CTE diploma shall be based on requirements designed to
- 10 provide students with technical skills and core academic skills and
- 11 shall demonstrate that the student is ready for a career in a technical
- 12 field.
- 3. Curriculum, programs of study, and course offerings shall be
- 14 determined by the local school district based on the needs and interests
- 15 of the students in the district. The state board of education shall work
- 16 in cooperation with individual school districts to stipulate the
- 17 minimum number of vocational offerings per district, with the goal of
- 18 establishing a minimum offering of six vocational areas of study in each
- 19 district. An effort shall be made by the local district to offer programs
- 20 of study relating to as many vocational career paths as economically
- 21 feasible to students in the district. In establishing curriculum

requirements, the district may incorporate standards for 23industry-recognized certifications.

4. The department of elementary and secondary education shall promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule 33 are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2015, shall 34 be invalid and void.
