Every instructor of an approved course shall file a copy of the course
description, outline, and proof of certification annually, or upon modification
of the course if more frequently, with the North Carolina Criminal Justice
Education and Training Standards Commission.

<b>SECTION 2.</b> State and local law enforcement agencies shall provide paramedics
rendering tactical medical assistance during a Special Weapons and Tactics operation with the
same protective equipment provided to other members of a Special Weapons and Tactics
operation.
<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to offenses
committed on or after that date.
