Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission the sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2019-2020 fiscal year to be used to cover costs incurred in establishing the School Faculty Guardian program required under G.S. 17C-6(a)(18), as enacted by Section 3 of this act.

**SECTION 6.** Section 5 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2019. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.

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
