1 2 3	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in inchoate crimes, prohibiting the possession of firearm at polling place.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	<u>§ 914. Possession of firearm at polling place.</u>
9	(a) Offense definedExcept as provided under subsections
10	(c) and (d)(2), a person commits an offense if the person:
11	(1) knowingly possesses a firearm in any building, real
12	property or parking area of a polling place holding an
13	election;
14	(2) knowingly possesses a firearm in any building, real
15	property or parking area of a polling place holding an
16	election with the intent of using the firearm in the
17	commission of a crime; or
18	(3) knowingly causes a firearm to be used in the
19	commission of a crime in any building real property or

1	parking area of a polling place holding an election.	
2	(b) GradingThe following apply:	
3	(1) An offense committed under subsection (a)(1) shall	
4	constitute a misdemeanor of the third degree.	
5	(2) An offense committed under subsection (a)(2) or (3)	
6	shall constitute a misdemeanor of the first degree.	
7	(c) ExceptionsSubsection (a) shall not apply to the	
8	lawful performance of official duties by an officer, agent or	
9	employee of the Federal Government, the Commonwealth or a	
10	political subdivision of the Commonwealth who is authorized to	
11	engage in or supervise the prevention, detection, investigation	
12	or prosecution of any violation of law.	
13	(d) Posting of noticeThe following apply:	
14	(1) Notice of the provisions of subsections (a), (b) and	
15	(c) shall be posted conspicuously at each public entrance of	
16	a building where a polling place is located during an	
17	election.	
18	(2) A person shall not be convicted of an offense under	
19	subsection (a)(1) or (2) if the polling place fails to meet	
20	the notice requirements under paragraph (1).	
21	(e) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following	
22	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this	
23	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:	
24	"Election." A general, municipal, special or primary	
25	election as authorized under the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333,	
26	No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code.	
27	"Firearm." Any weapon, including a starter gun, which will	
28	or is designed to expel a projectile or projectiles by the	
29	action of an explosion, expansion of gas or escape of gas. The	
30	term does not include any device designed or used exclusively

- 1 for the firing of stud cartridges, explosive rivets or similar
- 2 <u>industrial ammunition</u>.
- 3 "Polling place." The room provided in each election district
- 4 for voting during an election.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
