## ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1093

State of Washington 64th Legislature 2015 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to unmanned aircraft; adding a new chapter to 2 Title 14 RCW; and prescribing penalties.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Sec. 1. The legislature finds that technological 4 NEW SECTION. 5 developments in unmanned aircraft have expanded the vehicles' 6 capacity to be widely deployed in our state and in our communities. 7 legislature further finds that while the federal aviation The administration modernization and reform act of 2012 establishes a 8 regulatory framework for the use of unmanned aircraft by public 9 10 agencies and commercial entities, the recreational use of certain 11 small unmanned aircraft outside of federally controlled airspace is 12 exempt from federal regulation. The potential for these small 13 unmanned aircraft to be operated in close proximity to human 14 dwellings and activities presents opportunities for widespread recreational use and enjoyment. At the same time, the recreational 15 16 use of unmanned aircraft in Washington state airspace increases the 17 likelihood of physical trespass onto private property and invasions of personal privacy. The legislature intends to protect personal 18 privacy by prohibiting the use of unmanned aircraft equipped with 19 20 sensing devices that collect personal information, including images

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of individuals on private property that could not have been captured
without the assistance of the unmanned aircraft.

The legislature finds and declares that except as otherwise 3 required by the first amendment of the United States Constitution, 4 the reasonable expectation of privacy of a person whose image has 5 6 been captured, when the person is on private property and the 7 landowner and tenants with a right to occupy the private property have not consented to the capture of images of the person on the 8 property, has been violated when the image could not have been 9 captured from outside the boundaries of the property on which the 10 11 person is located, from an ordinary vantage point, and without the 12 assistance of the unmanned aircraft.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The definitions in this section apply 14 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires 15 otherwise.

16 (1) "Active sensing device" means a sensing device that is 17 acquiring personal information from its surroundings. A sensing 18 device is not an "active sensing device" when it is capable of 19 acquiring personal information from its surroundings, but this 20 functionality is dormant or has not been activated.

(2) "Person" means a natural person.

22 (3) "Personal information" means:

(a) Any information that describes, locates, or indexes anything 23 24 about a person including, but not limited to, his or her social 25 security number, driver's license number, agency-issued identification number, student identification number, real 26 or 27 personal property holdings derived from tax returns, and his or her 28 education, financial transactions, medical history, ancestry, religion, political ideology, or criminal or employment record; or 29

30 (b) Any image of a person taken from any location in the 31 Washington state airspace, when the person whose image has been 32 captured is on private property, the landowner and tenants with a 33 right to occupy the private property have not consented to the 34 capture of images of their person on the property, and the taking of 35 such an image is in violation of the reasonable expectation of 36 privacy of the person.

(4)(a) "Sensing device" means a device capable of acquiring
personal information from its surroundings through any means
including, but not limited to, cameras, thermal detectors,

microphones, chemical detectors, radiation gauges, and wireless
receivers in any frequency.

3 (b) "Sensing device" does not include equipment, the sole 4 function of which is to provide information directly necessary for 5 safe air navigation or piloting of an unmanned aircraft.

6 (5) "Unmanned aircraft" means an aircraft that is operated 7 without physical human presence on board the aircraft.

8 (6) "Washington state airspace" means all airspace within the 9 territorial limits of this state that is within class G airspace and 10 not otherwise classified as controlled by the federal aviation 11 administration.

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. (1) No person may operate an unmanned 13 aircraft in Washington state airspace that is equipped with an active 14 sensing device unless:

(a) The federal government has provided specific authorizationfor the operation; or

17 (b) The operation complies with each of the conditions18 established in section 4 of this act.

(2) For purposes of subsection (1) of this section and section 4 19 20 of this act, "specific authorization" by the federal government 21 includes authorization issued pursuant to the federal aviation administration modernization and reform act of 2012 (49 U.S.C. 40101) 22 or other federal authority establishing that the operation is lawful 23 24 and permitted under federal law, except that "specific authorization" does not include operation of an unmanned aircraft 25 pursuant to the exemption from regulation for recreational uses 26 27 established in the special rule for model aircraft of the federal aviation administration modernization and reform act of 2012 (49 28 U.S.C. 40101 Sec. 336). 29

30 (3) Nothing in this chapter may be construed as authorizing the 31 use of, prohibiting the use of, or regulating in any manner the use 32 of an unmanned aircraft by a public agency.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. An unmanned aircraft may not be operated 34 in Washington state airspace unless the following conditions are met: 35 (1) The unmanned aircraft has specific authorization from the 36 federal government, as defined in section 3 of this act; or

37 (2) The unmanned aircraft is clearly and conspicuously labeled38 with the name and contact information of the aircraft's owner and

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1 operator and does not have an active sensing device onboard that 2 collects personal information about any individual without the 3 individual's consent.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. Any person who violates the requirements 4 5 of section 4 of this act with the intent to capture any type of personal information of another person for an illicit purpose, б including a commercial purpose where the commercial use of the 7 unmanned aircraft is not compliant with the requirements of the 8 federal aviation administration modernization and reform act of 2012 9 10 or other applicable law, is guilty of a misdemeanor, in addition to any other penalty provided by law. 11

12 NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. In addition to any other remedies authorized by law, an individual whose reasonable expectation of 13 14 privacy is violated by the use of an unmanned aircraft equipped with 15 an active sensing device in violation of the requirements of this 16 chapter may bring an action for damages from the person who committed 17 the violation. The person may recover actual damages or liquidated 18 damages of five thousand dollars, whichever is greater, and an award 19 of costs and reasonable attorneys' fees.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. The remedy provided by this chapter does 21 not restrict any remedy that is otherwise available. The provisions 22 of this chapter are not exclusive and are in addition to any other 23 requirements, rights, remedies, and penalties provided by law.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. Sections 1 through 7 of this act 25 constitute a new chapter in Title 14 RCW.

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. If any provision of this act or its 27 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 28 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 29 persons or circumstances is not affected.

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
