## HOUSE BILL 1921

1 AN ACT Relating to adding new counties to a regional transit 2 authority; and amending RCW 81.112.050.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 81.112.050 and 2010 c 19 s 3 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

б (1) At the time of formation, the area to be included within the 7 boundary of the authority shall be that area set forth in the system plan adopted by the joint regional policy committee. Prior to 8 submitting the system and financing plan to the voters, the authority 9 10 may make adjustments to the boundaries as deemed appropriate but must 11 assure that, to the extent possible, the boundaries: (a) Include the 12 largest-population urban growth area designated by each county under chapter 36.70A RCW; and (b) follow election precinct boundaries. If a 13 14 portion of any city is determined to be within the service area, the entire city must be included within the boundaries of the authority. 15 16 Subsequent to formation, when territory is annexed to a city located 17 within the boundaries of the authority, the territory is simultaneously included within the boundaries of the authority and 18 subject to all taxes and other liabilities and obligations applicable 19 20 within the city with respect to the authority as provided in RCW

1 35.13.500 and 35A.14.475 and notwithstanding any other provision of 2 law.

(2)(a) After voters within the authority boundaries have approved 3 the system and financing plan, elections to add areas contiguous to 4 the authority boundaries may be called by resolution of the regional 5 6 transit authority, after consultation with affected transit agencies and with the concurrence of the legislative authority of the city or 7 town if the area is incorporated, or with the concurrence of the 8 county legislative authority if the area is unincorporated. Only 9 those areas that would benefit from the services provided by the 10 11 authority may be included and services or projects proposed for the 12 area must be consistent with the regional transportation plan. The election may include a single ballot proposition providing for 13 14 annexation to the authority boundaries and imposition of the taxes at rates already imposed within the authority boundaries. 15

16 (b)(i) Elections to add counties or portions of counties west of 17 the crest of the Cascade mountains that are contiguous with counties already within the authority boundaries may be called by resolution 18 of the regional transit authority, after consultation with affected 19 transit agencies and with the concurrence of the legislative 20 authority of the city or town if the area is incorporated, the 21 concurrence of the county legislative authority if the area is 22 unincorporated, or with the concurrence of each of the affected 23 legislative authorities if the area contains both incorporated and 24 25 unincorporated areas. Only those areas that would benefit from the services provided by the authority may be included, and services or 26 projects proposed for the area must be consistent with the regional 27 transportation plan. The election may include a single ballot 28 proposition providing for annexation to the authority boundaries and 29 30 imposition of the taxes at rates already imposed within the authority 31 boundaries.

32 (ii) Any county or portion of a county added to the authority 33 pursuant to this subsection (2)(b) is considered a separate 34 transportation subarea for purposes of any transportation subarea 35 equity element utilized by the authority.

36 (3) Upon receipt of a resolution requesting exclusion from the 37 boundaries of the authority from a city whose municipal boundaries 38 cross the boundaries of an authority and thereby result in only a 39 portion of the city being subject to local option taxes imposed by 40 the authority under chapter((s)) 81.104 ((and 81.112)) RCW and this 1 chapter in order to implement a high capacity transit plan, and where the vote to approve the city's incorporation occurred simultaneously 2 with an election approving the local option taxes, then upon a two-3 thirds majority vote of the governing board of the authority, the 4 governing board shall redraw the boundaries of the authority to 5 exclude that portion of the city that is located within the 6 authority's boundaries, and the excluded area is no longer subject to 7 local option taxes imposed by the authority. This subsection expires 8 December 31, 1998. 9

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
