- 7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-301, as amended by 15LSO-0001
- 12 conforming Wyoming Statute to Powers v. State, 2014 WY 15,
- 13 318 P.3d 300 and Powers v. State, No. 180-673 (1st Jud.
- 14 Dist. Ct. Apr. 18, 2014), is amended to read:

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2 removal of members; meetings; chairman.

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4 (a) There is created a state board of education 5 composed of thirteen (13) members, eleven (11) five (5) of whom shall be appointed members with at least one (1) 6 member appointed from each appointment district pursuant to 7 8 W.S. 9-1-218. Appointments from each appointment district 9 shall be rotated among the several counties comprising the 10 district at large by the governor and six (6) shall be elected by nonpartisan ballot in accordance with subsection 11 12 (b) of this section. The remaining voting member of the 13 board shall be the state superintendent of public The executive director of the Wyoming 14 instruction. 15 community college commission shall be an ex-officio member 16 and shall not have the right to vote. One (1) appointed 17 member shall be appointed at large and shall be a certified 18 classroom teacher at the time of appointment, one (1) 19 appointed member shall also be appointed at large and shall 20 be a certified school administrator at the time of 21 appointment, . Two (2) appointed members shall be appointed 22 at large one (1) shall be a member of a board of trustees 23 of a school district with enrollment greater than the

statewide average Wyoming school district, as computed at 1 2 the time of appointment, one (1) shall be a member of a 3 board of trustees of a school district with enrollment less 4 than the average Wyoming school district, as computed at 5 the time of appointment and one (1) shall representative of private business or industry in Wyoming. 6 On and after March 1, 2013 and upon expiration of their 7 8 respective terms, the appointments of the two (2) members previously designated to be representative of business or 9 industry shall be at large, one (1) a representative of 10 Wyoming private business or industry and one (1) a member 11 12 of a school district board of trustees at the time of appointment. The first appointment to the term of such 13 14 member which expires on or after March 1, 2013, shall be a 15 school district board member at the time of appointment. 16 The remaining seven (7) appointed members of the board shall be appointed from among the lay citizens of the state 17 18 who are electors of the state, known for their public 19 spirit, business or professional ability and interest in 20 education. Not more than six (6) appointed members of the 21 board shall be from one (1) political party. Members shall be appointed for six (6) year terms, except those who may 22 23 be appointed to fill unexpired terms. Appointed members

shall be appointed by the governor with the approval of 1 2 confirmed by the senate. Vacancies shall be filled by the 3 governor without senate approval until the next session of 4 the legislature. No member is eligible to reappointment, except any member appointed to fill an unexpired term of 5 less than six (6) years may be reappointed for one (1) 6 additional six (6) year term. Appointed members of the 7 8 board may be removed by the governor as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. 9 10 (b) As provided by subsection (a) of this section, 11 12 six (6) voting members of the state board shall be elected 13 for a term of four (4) years by nonpartisan ballot at each 14 general election pursuant to the provisions of this section 15 and title 22 of the Wyoming statutes. One (1) member shall 16 be elected from among the qualified elector residents of each of the following six (6) election districts: 17 18 19 (i) State board of education district 1 which 20 shall consist of senate legislative districts 4, 5, 6, 7 21 and 8;

Vacancies in other offices; temporary 2 appointments. 3 4 (a) Any vacancy in any other elective office in the 5 state except representative in congress or the board of trustees of a school or community college district, shall 6 be filled by the governing body, or as otherwise provided 7 8 in this section, by appointment of a temporary successor. The person appointed shall serve until a successor for the 9 remainder of the unexpired term is elected at the next 10 11 general election and takes office on the first Monday of 12 the following January. 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(a) As necessary to conform with the requirements of 15 16 W.S. 21-2-301(a), as amended by section 1 of this act, as applicable, the governor shall appoint one (1) member to 17 18 the state board which, at the time of appointment, is a 19 member of a board of trustees of a school district with 20 enrollment either more or less than the average Wyoming 21 school district, depending upon the enrollment of the district of that board member appointed to represent a 22 23 school district board of trustees prior to the effective

1 date of this act. The term of the appointment under this

2 subsection shall commence on January 7, 2019.

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4 (b) The service of the seven (7) members appointed at large to the state board prior to the effective date of 5 this act, who represent the lay citizens of the state who 6 are electors of the state, known for their public spirit, 7 8 business or professional ability and interest in education 9 and who were not appointed to fulfill the requirements for 10 a certified classroom teacher, a certified administrator, a representative of private business or 11 12 industry in Wyoming or a representative of a school 13 district board of trustees, shall terminate on January 7,

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2019.

16 (c) The election of six (6) state board members as
17 required by W.S. 21-2-301(a), as amended by section 1 of
18 this act, as applicable, shall commence with the 2018
19 general election by nonpartisan ballot. The service of the
20 elected members shall commence on January 7, 2019.
21 Notwithstanding W.S. 21-2-301(b), the initial term of the
22 elected state board members from board of education

1 election districts 1, 3 and 5 shall be for a term of two

2 (2) years.

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4 (d) The provisions of W.S. 21-2-301(a), as amended by

5 section 1 of this act, as applicable, shall not be

6 implemented in a manner that affects the terms of those

7 state board members appointed prior to the effective date

8 of this act and appointed at large to represent a certified

9 classroom teacher, a certified school administrator, a

10 representative of private business or industry in Wyoming

11 or a member of a school district school board of trustees.

12 Any member appointed prior to the effective date of this

13 act and serving on the effective date of this act may be

14 reappointed if otherwise qualified for reappointment under

15 W.S. 21-2-301 (a).

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Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2015.
