AN ACT relating to chiropractic physicians; changing the 1 title of chiropractic practitioners from "chiropractor" to 2 "chiropractic physician"; conforming related statutory 3 references; and providing for an effective date. 4 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 6 7 8 Section 1. W.S. 33-10-101, 33-10-102, 33-10-103, 9 33-10-105(c) and (d)(intro), 33-10-109, 33-10-113(a) and (c), 33-10-117, 33-12-140(a) and 33-25-102(c)(intro) and 10 (e)(ii) are amended to read: 11 12 13 CHAPTER 10 14 CHIROPRACTIC PHYSICIANS 15 16 33-10-101. Chiropractic defined.

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2 Chiropractic is the system of specific adjustment or 3 manipulation of the joints and tissues of the body and the 4 treatment of the human body by the application of manipulative, manual, mechanical, physiotherapeutic 5 or clinical nutritional methods for which those 6 persons licensed under this chapter are trained and may include 7 8 venipuncture, acupuncture and the use of diagnostic x-rays 9 with rights for referral for advanced diagnostic imaging. 10 A chiropractor chiropractic physician may examine, diagnose 11 and treat patients provided, however, chiropractors 12 chiropractic physicians shall not perform surgery, direct 13 the use of or administer drugs required by law to be dispensed on prescription only, practice obstetrics or 14 prescribe or administer x-ray therapy. For purposes of this 15 16 act, "venipuncture" means the puncture of the vein for the 17 withdrawal of blood.

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19 33-10-102. Board of chiropractic examiners;
20 established; composition; qualifications of members.
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22 There is hereby created and established a board to be known

23 as the state board of chiropractic examiners, which shall

be composed of one (1) member of the public at large and 1 2 four (4) practicing chiropractors chiropractic physicians 3 of integrity and ability, who shall be residents of the 4 state of Wyoming, who shall have practiced chiropractic continuously in the state of Wyoming for a period of at 5 least three (3) years and who shall have a diploma from an 6 accredited chiropractic school or college. 7 8 9 33-10-103. Board of chiropractic examiners; appointment; term; qualifications; vacancies; removal. 10 11 12 The governor shall appoint four (4) practicing 13 chiropractors chiropractic physicians, who shall possess the qualifications specified in W.S. 33-10-102, and one (1) 14 15 citizen from the public at large to constitute the 16 membership of the board. Members shall be appointed to a term of four (4) years, except that initial terms of 17 18 chiropractor chiropractic physician members shall be 19 staggered so that annually thereafter the governor shall 20 appoint one (1) chiropractor chiropractic physician member. 21 The governor shall fill all vacancies occurring in the The governor may remove any board member as 22 board. 23 provided in W.S. 9-1-202.

License required. 3 4 (c) The board pursuant to its rules and regulations may issue a temporary license to an applicant who is 5 licensed or certified by a board of chiropractic of another 6 United States state or territory, or of a foreign country 7 8 or province whose standards are equal to or exceed the 9 requirements for licensure as a chiropractor chiropractic physician in this state. 10 11 12 (d) No business entity organized under title 17 of the Wyoming statutes shall employ or contract with a 13 14 chiropractor chiropractic physician to provide chiropractic 15 services unless fifty-one percent (51%) of the equity in 16 the entity is owned by persons, and the spouses of persons, 17 licensed pursuant to title 33, chapter 9, 10 or 26 of the 18 Wyoming statutes. This subsection shall not apply to: 19 20 33-10-109. Title of practitioners. 21 Chiropractors Chiropractic physicians licensed under this 22 act shall have the right to practice chiropractic in 23

accordance with the method taught in the chiropractic 1 2 schools and colleges recognized by the chiropractic board 3 of examiners of this state. If a chiropractor chiropractic 4 physician chooses to use the prefix "Dr." or "doctor" on any display sign before the name of the practitioner, the 5 display shall also include the title "doctor of 6 chiropractic, " "chiropractic physician," "chiropractor," 7 8 "D.C." or the equivalent. 9 33-10-113. Prerequisite for renewal of 10 license; 11 board's power to make regulations; fees. 12 13 (a) Each chiropractor chiropractic physician shall, 14 as a prerequisite to annual license renewal, submit as a part of the renewal application satisfactory evidence of 15 16 having completed the continuing education requirements established by the board in its rules and regulations. 17 18 19 (c) All persons practicing chiropractic within this 20 state shall pay on or before August 1 of each year, a 21 renewal license fee in an amount established by the board pursuant to W.S. 33-1-201. If any practicing chiropractor 22 23 chiropractic physician fails to pay the renewal license fee 5

imposed by W.S. 33-10-101 through 33-10-117 within thirty 1 2 (30) days after the due date, the license shall lapse. A 3 lapsed license shall only be restored within one (1) year 4 of expiration upon written application and payment to the board of a fee of twice the amount of the renewal fee in 5 effect at the time the restoration application is filed. 6 7 33-10-117. Restrictions. 8 9 Nothing contained in this act shall be construed to 10 11 restrain or restrict licensed or certified members of other 12 legally recognized professions from performing services 13 consistent with the laws of this state, provided they do not represent themselves as practicing the profession 14 15 regulated under this act and do not represent themselves to be chiropractors chiropractic physicians. Nothing contained 16 in this act shall be construed to restrain or restrict the 17 18 practice of venipuncture or acupuncture. 19 20 33-12-140. Exemptions.

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(a) Nothing in this act shall prohibit servicesrendered by licensed physicians, nurses, dentists,

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podiatrists, chiropractors chiropractic physicians,

2 physical therapists, morticians or barbers when exclusively 3 engaged in the practice of their respective professions. 4 33-25-102. Practice of physical therapy; license or 5 6 certificate required; exceptions; false representations. 7 8 Except as provided in this subsection, a physical (C) therapist with a master's degree, or a bachelor's degree 9 10 with five (5) years of clinical experience may initiate physical therapy treatment for a new or recurring injury 11 12 with or without a prescription from a licensed physician 13 including doctor of osteopathy, podiatrist, advanced 14 practitioner of nursing, dentist, chiropractor chiropractic 15 physician or physician assistant. Nothing in this 16 subsection shall be construed to preclude a physical therapist from treating a chronic or recurring injury or 17 18 condition without a prescription, provided that the patient 19 or client was previously diagnosed and prescribed physical 20 therapy treatment within the previous year by a health care 21 provider identified in this subsection and the treatment is directly related to the original prescribed care. Except in 22 23 an emergency, a physical therapist, without a prescription,

is prohibited from initiating physical therapy treatment 1 2 for children under the age of twelve (12) years, unless the 3 child is to receive physical therapy treatment under an 4 individualized education program or an individualized family services plan. A physical therapist shall refer the 5 patient or client to a licensed physician including doctor 6 osteopathy, podiatrist, advanced practitioner of 7 of 8 nursing, dentist, chiropractor chiropractic physician or 9 physician assistant, as appropriate, when: 10 11 (e) Prior to any physical therapy service, the 12 patient or client shall be directed to posted information 13 and delivered a handout explaining: 14 15 (ii) That coverage may not be available through 16 governmental or worker's compensation programs unless prescribed by a physician, physician's assistant, dentist, 17 chiropractor chiropractic physician, podiatrist or nurse 18 19 practitioner; and 20 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2015. 21 22 23 (END)
